Project Summary:

The project will focus on engaging with children in primary school and also older secondary ages students 12-16 year old. The young people in primary school will be give make your own turbine kits. There will be a competition where they will be given prizes based on efficiency (tested on site), creativity and best recycled materials used. The competition will be more open for secondary aged children. They will just be given a specification so that their turbine fits onto the testing motor onsite. The money spent will be on the kits, promotion and prizes. The focus of the project is to inspire these young people to find an interest in STEM activities, especially relating to environmental technologies, while also opening them up to the various engineering courses and careers on offer, particularly in the surrounding area.

Background

- 3. Area Boards have authority to approve funding under powers delegated to them. Under the Scheme of Delegation Area Boards must adhere to the Area Board Funding and Grants Criteria. This document is available on the council's website.
- 4. Three funding streams are available to the Area Board, each with an annually awarded amount. These funding streams are as follows:
 - Community Area Grants (capital)
 - Youth Grants (revenue)
 - Older and Vulnerable People Grants (revenue)
- 5. The Area Board will be advised of the funding available prior to their first meeting of each financial year.

- 6. Councillors need to be satisfied that the applications meet the requirements as set out in the Area Board Funding and Grants Criteria and that the health and wellbeing and young persons funding guidelines have been adhered to.
- 7. Councillors must ensure that the distribution of funding is in accordance with the Scheme of Delegation to Area Boards.
- 8. Councillors need to consider any recommendations made by sub groups of the Area Boards.
