Project Summary:

This is a community not-for-profit event aimed at young people and families. It is an outdoor event held on Church Common in the centre of our village. This will be our third festival. It provides a showcase for both emerging young local musicians and also international, established artists. This year we are working with and supporting local youth charity Seeds4Success by involving their students and want to be able to make a financial contribution to the charity after the event.

Background
