### **Review of a Dispensation Request**

# Review of a Request for Dispensation from Councillor David Grover of Steeple Langford Parish Council

### Introduction

- 1. On 8 March 2011 the Monitoring Officer received a request for a dispensation from Councillor Grover, a member of Steeple Langford Parish Council. Councillor Grover's completed Dispensation Request Form is attached.
- 2. Councillor Grover is an allotment holder of allotments in the area of the parish council. He also owns a house adjacent to the allotments. He therefore has a personal and prejudicial interest in council agenda matters relating to the allotments.
- **3.** There is a proposal to build affordable housing on some of the allotment site.
- **4.** The Steeple Langford Allotments are managed by a charitable trust. Two of the Steeple Langford Parish Council members are trustees of the allotment trust and have personal and prejudicial interests arising from their position as trustees.
- 5. There are seven councillors on Steeple Langford Parish Council. Two councillors are trustees of the allotment trust, and another two (Councillor Grover and Councillor Watson) have a personal and prejudicial interest in the allotments by virtue of being an allotment holder and living next to the site of the allotments.
- 6. This means that four of the seven members of Steeple Langford Parish Council have a personal and prejudicial interest in the Steeple Langford Allotments, representing 57% of the total membership of the parish council. The parish council is inquorate when considering matters relating to the allotments.

- 7. The Dispensation Sub-Committee considered Councillor Grover's request on 13 May 2011 and decided not to grant a dispensation on the grounds that it was not in the public interest to do so (copy of minutes attached).
- **8.** Currently, two of the seven members of the parish council hold dispensations in relation to the consideration of council business concerning the Steeple Langford allotments.
- **9.** On 4 January 2012 Councillor Grover informed the Monitoring Officer that he is no longer a trustee of the Steeple Langford Allotments and has requested that his application for a dispensation be reconsidered. He is, however, still an allotment holder and owner of a house adjacent to the allotments. His request is attached.

## **Criteria for Determination of Requests**

- **10.** Under Section 17(1)(a)(i) of The Standards Committee (Further Provisions) (England) Regulations 2009 (**enclosed**), the Dispensation Sub-Committee may grant a dispensation where the transaction of the Council's business would otherwise be impeded by, or as a result of, the Code of Conduct because more than 50% of the members who would be entitled to vote at a meeting are prohibited from voting.
- **11.** The Dispensation Sub-Committee may grant a dispensation:
  - a. for one item of business
  - b. for a period not exceeding 4 years
  - c. allowing the member to participate in the meeting and vote
  - d. allowing the member to speak but not vote
- **12.** In reaching a decision on a dispensation request the Dispensation Sub-Committee must:
  - have regard to guidance issued by Standards for England (enclosed);
  - b. disregard any dispensations that have already been granted to other members of the same body; and
  - c. take into account:
    - i. the nature of the member's prejudicial interest:
    - ii. the need to maintain public confidence in the conduct of the Council's business:
    - iii. the impact on the outcome of the proposed vote;
    - iv. the need for efficient and effective conduct of the Council's business:
    - v. any other relevant circumstances.

**9.** The Dispensation Sub-Committee is therefore requested to determine this request for a dispensation.
