Community Safety

Our reactions to the information provided:	 Alcohol Abuse - could be related to cheap and easy access, not just about young but all ages. This could also be linked with previous family history. Domestic Abuse - linked to alcohol abuse. This has a significant effect on the children Drug Abuse - is the highest level in Wiltshire but also have high detection rates. Anti Social Behaviour - Neighbourhood Watch Schemes no longer seem to be effective. Police Intervention - More intervention needed by the Police/Cllrs and public, particularly in Durrington.
Our priorities for action:	 Alcohol Abuse Action - Better leisure facilities, targeted referrals and education. Drug abuse Action - Better detection, and education. Set up a schools working groups. Problem more prominent than was first though. Domestic Abuse Action - This shows up in schools with the children national and local initiatives already, but better counselling for wives (military).
