1. The Prevention of harm to children

Friends with young children visit us and late night noise could prevent them from sleeping.

2. To Prevent public nuisance

This will be the latest venue open so people will come to this pub to continue drinking here after other pubs have closed. Old Malmesbury Road has no street lighting at night and no footpaths so there could be problems with vehicles leaving the car park late at night.

The Human Rights Act 1998 states that we have a right to "Peaceful and Undisturbed Enjoyment of our home without noise pervading the property". The proposed later opening hours of this pub could breach our Human Rights with all the noise of vehicles leaving the car park and could have a detrimental effect on our quality of life.

3. To prevent crime and disorder

The proposed later opening hours are unacceptable and could cause late night (and early morning) problems due to the congregating of people and cars who have been to the pub.

4. Public Safety

Concern over extra litter in the road (ie broken glass etc), currently there is no street cleaning in Old Malmesbury Road by the Council

Suggested Actions

We have major concerns over our property which adjoins the car park of the Prince of Wales. To ensure the protection of our property, our back fence adjoins the car park of the pub, cars already drive into our fence and we have serious concerns that Vehicles could crash through our fence.

The exterior lights of the pub are not in use nor is their light working in the car park. It is not safe for residents to walk down the road at night and could be much worse with later opening times of the pub.
