We have been operating as a club dedicated to teaching and practicing the the art of judo for over 40 years .Our main catchment area is in the Vale of Pewsey and Marlborough area and includes the surrounding villages . Our club is currently based a Pewsey Leisure Centre with a current membership of thirty two members ranging in age from 5 years to 65 years . We actively support the County Councils Sportivate Project that enables young people to sample alternative sports other than those offered in the school curriculum or youth club enviroment this has also led to increased membership. As a legacy of the 2012 Olympic there has been an upsurge of interest in Judo by both the young and not so young and the club wish to expand our current mat area that has become a limited factor in welcoming new members. Wilton Pond is on the Deeds of Victoria House whose garden runs down to part of the ponds boundary. The pond is spring fed from the surrounding chalk hills and is situated where the chalk meets the eastern end of the Pewsey Vale greensand . A bourne runs into the pond under flood conditions draining the farmland and roads from the surrounding area. This silt has to be cleaned out to enable the wildlife on the pond to be rejuvenated and the beautiful appearance to be enhanced so that it continues to attract tourist to the area. The Parish Council are leading the local community Pond Rejuvenation Project and have to date received signatures supporting their plans from 453 local residents and 280 visitors to the area.

Rejuvenation of Wilton Pond

6. Project summary:

The Parish Council are leading the local project to Rejuvenate Wilton Pond. The wild ducks, water voles, pond insect life and fish which once lived in and on the pond no longer do so. The silt deposits need pumping out and the depth of water in the pond needs to be increased to improve the environment for the pond life and aquatic birds. Advice has been sought, and permission to deposit the silt on local farmland has been obtained from the Environment Agency. Our local Community have offered to help with the manual work and the necessary support facilities.

In order to ensure the project is managed correctly and provides the maximum benefit to the environment, the pond insect life, the aquatic birds and animals as well as our local residents and visitors, advice has been obtained from Rod dâ€™Ayala (a specialist who works for the Pond Trust), The Wiltshire Wildfowl Trust and experts in environmental safety and water quality. Wildlife will benefit - our goal is that wild ducks will return to the pond, and by increasing the water depth this will enable water voles to live in the banks and a wider spectrum of pond life, amphibians and fish will live in the rejuvenated pond. To encourage this, plantings around the pond will be done following the silt removal. Visitors will be able to stop and enjoy the spring fed pond rather than just walking past it. The pond is on the circular walk from Wilton Windmill to Crofton via the Roman road and Wilton Water and this project will enhance the pleasurable experience of our visitors to this beautiful part of the Pewsey Vale.

The project will support approximately 200 older people through presentations and publicity undertaken. Using criteria to identifying those most at risk she will be providing intensive one to one support to 10 older, vulnerable people (aged 60+) in the area. Operating November 2013 until March 2014, intensive support will be provided to these clients to ensure that they can stay warm, healthy and engaged at a time when they are at their most vulnerable. The journey starts with a visit in their home, tailored to an individual's specific needs this might include a look at how they can save money on their energy bills including giving plenty of practical energy saving tips for around the house. By providing regular follow up contact (usually weekly but always during bad weather) throughout winter to ensure that they have the security & support they need to stay healthy & warm. This on-going support can range from something as simple as arranging for essential shopping during a particularly icy period to something as complex as arranging transport to a medical appointment after a heavy snowfall. In addition, we will be undertaking promotional activity throughout the area highlighting the importance of staying warm, well and active which will be targeted specifically to the over 60s. Through a combination of presentations at local clubs and events and articles in local publications we will provide sound information and advice about staying warm and healthy and who to contact for additional support.
