As you can see from the current figures prepared at the time of writing this report (April 14) we have seen a general overall fall in crime and anti social behaviour over the past year other than burglary, both dwelling and non-dwelling. Dwelling burglary is just over with a rise of two reported offences. The neighbourhood teams and other departments within the service continue to work hard to prevent and detect these offences. As reported previously, intelligence work is a big part of the preventive strategy and we will continue to liaise closely with our neighbouring forces to share relevant and timely information.

It goes without saying that the reductions seen over the past year would not be possible had it not been for the support and engagement we have with our communities, so for that I say a big thank you.
