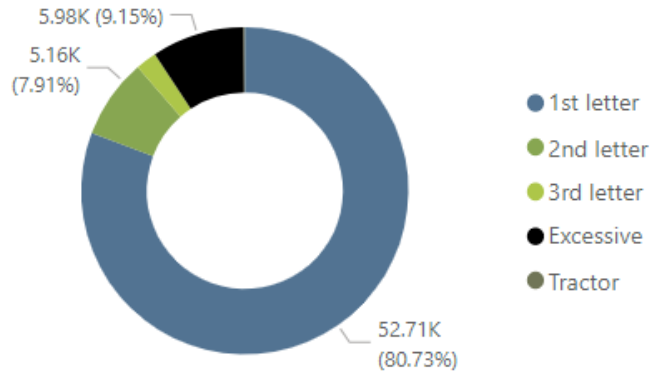

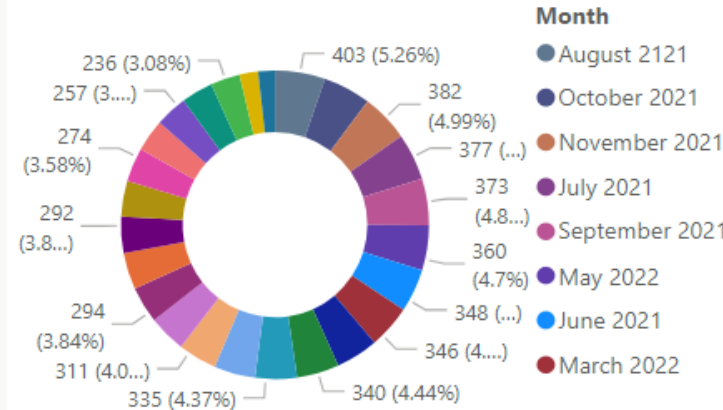

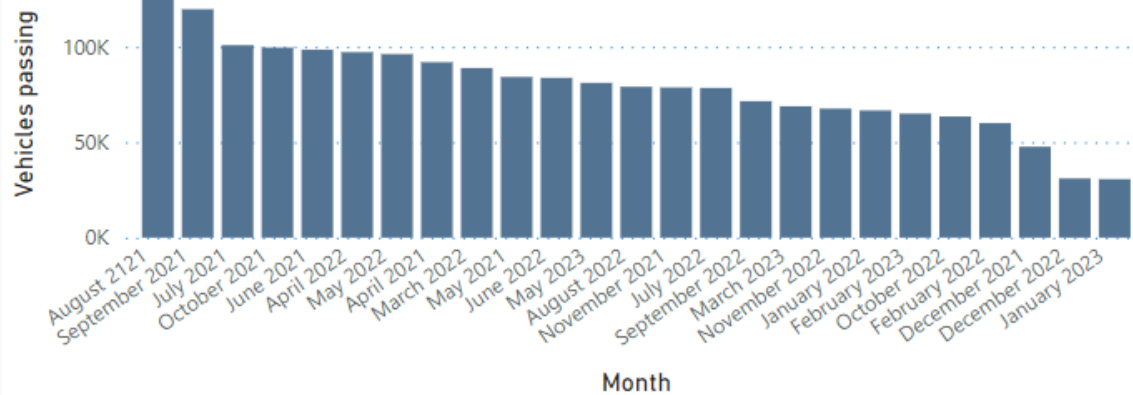

# Performance – 12 Months to February 2023

## Force

- Wiltshire Police recorded crime reports a YoY increase of 7% in the 12 months to February 2023 and continues to have one of the lowest crime rates in the country per 1,000 population.
- Wiltshire Police has seen a 14.3% increase in violence without injury crimes in the 12 months to February 2023.
- In February 2023, we received:
  - 8,604 '999' calls, which we answered within 6 seconds on average;
  - 14,558 '101' calls, which we answered within 31 seconds on average;
  - 8,611 CRIB calls, which we answered within 8 minutes on average.
- In February 2023, we also attended 1,424 emergency incidents within 10 minutes and 21 seconds on average.

### Stop and Search information for Devizes CPT

During the 12 months leading to January 2023, 116 stop and searches were conducted in the Devizes area of which 62.9% related to a search for controlled drugs.

During 82.8% of these searches, no object was found. In 17.2% of cases, an object was found. Of these cases 81.9% resulted in a no further action disposal; 17.2% resulted in police action being taken; 9.5% resulted in an arrest.

Of the stop and search subjects who defined their ethnicity:

- White – 75 stop and searches
- Black or Black British – 6 stop and searches
- Asian or Asian British – 3 stop and searches
- Mixed – 7 stop and searches

# Performance – Hate Crime Overview

## Force

Monthly hate crime volumes remain within nominal bounds with no exception. Year on year trend data is reporting increases in Transgender and Sexual Orientation related hate which follows National trends.

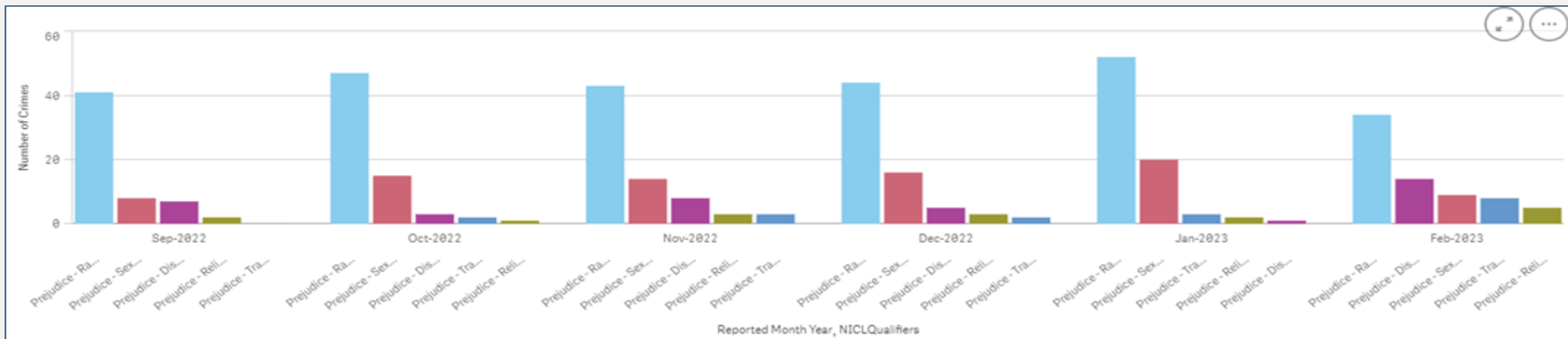
Data from the victim satisfaction survey reports that Hate Crime victims have an 84.5% overall satisfaction rate with the service they receive from Wiltshire Police.

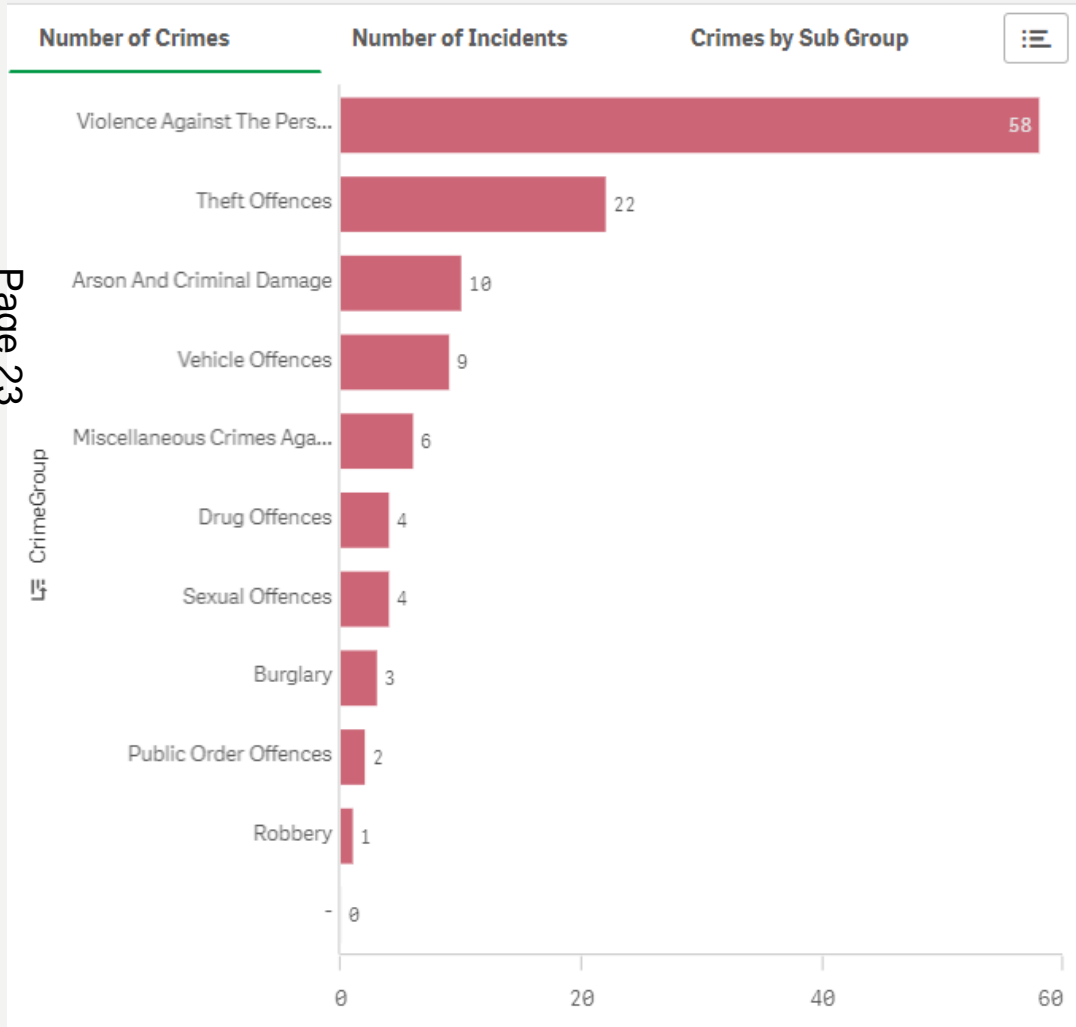
Year on year comparison February 2022 to February 2023 (note: an individual crime can be tagged with more than one prejudice type e.g. sexual orientation & transgender)

# Local Priorities & Updates

Priority	Update
Burglaries/theft	There has been an increase in low thefts and breaks in rural properties. This is a cross border issue with offenders primarily attending from the Thames Valley and Hampshire areas. In order to combat, a dedicated operation is in place with the rural crime team. This is joint up with surrounding forces and focuses on both prevention through crime safety advice to premises, and targeting of offenders. This is also linked to wider hare coursing offences and Operation Galileo. This is also linked to commercial breaks being seen across the area.
Retail Theft	An increase noted in retail theft in Marlborough. Active work ongoing to both deal with offenders and provide crime prevention/safety advice.
Increase In police visibility	A core current priority is to increase police visibility within the community, through both physical and online presence. More details to be announced soon but will include clear advertising of drop in sessions and accessibility, and a review of Police engagement/attendance at Parish Council level.
Theft from 'Beauty Spots'	As we move into the nicer weather/seasons- we are likely to start seeing an increase in thefts from vehicles in beauty spot locations. Early ongoing work with other forces and agencies and this will see enhanced police action as the seasons change.
