Isolated Older adults who live independently. They will benefit from activities which are good for their mental and physical health through the five ways to wellbeing including helping breathing cardiovascular health stability and strength as well as mindfulness all in a supportive environment which enables people to get to know each other to create a sense of group and belonging and providing a reason to venture out try new things and meet new people.

14. How will you monitor this?

We are going to continue to find ways to reach are target audience including attending meetings at the sheltered housing and offering taster sessions. We have applied for funding to develop 11 work to help develop relationships and sign post to the group. In addition, we will monitor numbers and evaluate the sessions through evaluation forms and final interviews.

15. Safeguarding. Please tell us about how you will protect and safeguard those involved in your project

iiD is committed to safeguarding and the welfare of participants staff and volunteers. Sarah Gilmartin is the lead person responsible for safeguarding in the organisation. iID has a safeguarding policy which the board annually reviews, and it is a requirement of staff and volunteer contracts that they follow. Anyone who is employed, or volunteers has to have an enhanced DBS check as we work with children and vulnerable adults in addition to insurance and referencing this information is held securely centrally. Volunteers under 18 are not allowed to be alone with any participant. Sarah has recently undertaken adult and children safeguarding training with the NHS. Risk Assessments are undertaken for every activity.

16. If your project will continue after the Wiltshire Council funding runs out, how will you continue to fund it?

Applications to ACE and Big Lottery are being made to continue to work with this group and develop this area of work in Corsham. The idea of weekly donations is also being trialed in the hope that the group grows and participants value it enough to contribute more than the minimum fee each week to start to accumulate a pot for future sessions and minimise the subsidy required although we know some people will not attend if there is a larger fee so a level of subsidy will always be necessary to reach those most in need of this activity and opportunity.
