6. Wiltshire Primary Care Trust – Update on Reforming Community Services

Alison Knowles, Director for Corporate Affairs and Communications, will give a verbal update on progress made by the PCT since the last meeting.

Since the last meeting the Neighbourhood Teams have gone live and a number of changes have been made to community hospital services in Devizes and Chippenham.

The Pathways for Change Task Group met on 22 June to hear from representatives of the PCT who are putting together the Neighbourhood Teams. A short summary of this meeting is attached.

Members are asked to note the updates. The Service Reconfiguration Task Group will continue in its monitoring role and will report any concerns to the Committee.

Also attached is a letter from the Department of Health in response to the letter sent by the Chairman to the Secretary of State in May. Since the letter was sent there has been a change in the Cabinet and a new Secretary of State appointed.

7. Avon Valley Practice – Update on Consultation

Alison Knowles will give a verbal update about the consultation, which will end on 23 July 2007.

The consultation document and questionnaire are attached.

The Committee is asked to consider its response to the consultation and may wish to consider appointing a small working party of two or three members to put together the response on behalf of the Committee.

8. Wiltshire PCT Urgent Care Strategy

Nicholas Gillard of Wiltshire PCT will present the Urgent Care Strategy on behalf of the PCT.

The draft Urgent Care Strategy is attached for consideration.

9. Delayed Transfers of Care

Wiltshire has a history of problems with delayed transfers of care from hospitals back into the community or a sheltered/care setting.

A short paper has been attached outlining the nature of the problem.

Delayed transfers of care have a great effect on all the agencies providing care, as well as on the patients and their families.

Members are asked to consider the points raised by the report and the suggestion that a scrutiny task group carries out a review.

10. South West Health Scrutiny Network

Members will be aware that for the last two years the Centre for Public Scrutiny has made development money available to individual health OSCs, which Wiltshire has used to hold a series of seminars.

However, this money has now been discontinued and a sum of money will be made available for health OSCs to run a regional scrutiny network.

Further details about the network are contained within the paper attached.

Members are asked to note the paper and to feed any views on the development of the South West Health Scrutiny Network to the health scrutiny officer.
