What is the Community benefit of your project, and approximately how many people will benefit? **Background**

As the Calne Community Area Partner in all transport matters CAT has worked closely with the County Council on improving cycleways and footpaths as well as promoting public transport and Wigglybus. CAT set up a Wigglybus Marketing Group, networked through a range of organisations and individuals, redesigned the Wigglybus leaflet assisted by John Bentley School and the Chamber of Commerce, consulted widely with information outlets, and organised transport stalls. Ridership figures have greatly improved as a result. (See http://www.gocalne.org.uk/files/Wigglybus map and times.pdf).

Achievement

This work has helped bring the subsidy cost down from £12.00 to £3.20 per passenger. Calne's Wigglybus performance is better than that for the Kennet Valley Wigglybus service and some of the Pewsey Vale services that have been running 3 years longer! Whilst this result does not guarantee that the County Council will support the service beyond 2007 when government subsidy expires, *it demonstrates CAT's potential to achieve the best out of existing services and maximise future growth.*

CAT's transport strategy

CAT wishes to build on its successful "word of mouth" evidence based method of marketing for **all** transport matters for the **whole** area. It has developed an innovative "Go-Between" marketing strategy which brings detailed evidence of transport need and means of provision working through volunteers. The method comprises 12 related but distinct activities, or "<u>Steps</u>", leading to a highly effective travel brokerage system.

<u>Step 1</u> delivered the first edition of a one stop travel information website (www.gocalne.org.uk). <u>Steps 2 to 5</u> involved CAT volunteers providing travel information to householders with a brief travel survey to identify transport issues and gaps. This was piloted by volunteers, initially for Wigglybus purposes, in selected neighbourhoods in Bremhill, Derry Hill, Calne and Avebury Trusloe. The approach brought valuable evidence for **all** transport issues.

Project description: Steps 6 – 11

It is critical to CAT volunteers to gather detailed information about all transport provision serving the area and its potential to meet local travel needs prior to rolling out the above activities (Steps 2 to 5) across the whole of the Calne area. <u>Steps 6 to 10 provides an assessment of the range of transport provision and its</u> potential to meet travel need found by CAT volunteers (The data from this will enable the method developed in Steps 2 to 5 above to be implemented across the whole area) and <u>Step 11</u> examines the scope of developing a multi modal travel hub.

Research and system design

Thus to develop this new pattern of marketing and brokering for the rest of the Community Area, CAT needs an assessment of:

- what transport provision exists, and
- the potential to meet the serious shortfalls in provision that CAT volunteers have uncovered.

There are over 10 categories of transport provision in Calne. None is likely to be performing to its full potential. This "Audit, Investigation and Review" is a skilled research project that needs to be carried out by experienced professionals assisted by a group of CAT volunteers. The role of the volunteer team is to bring local knowledge to the research, liaison with CAT committee, and equip the community partnership with the necessary tools to negotiate independently in the future. This will lead directly to the sustainability of the group's transport strategy for Calne.

Outputs

The research will show:

- •The extent of under utilised transport capacity serving Calne Community Area
- •The extent of travel opportunities across the week, (day and evenings)
- •The potential to negotiate developments with the providers (and local authority)

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The ability of the community to negotiate greater utilisation (matching need with provision)

•The scope for developing a network of multi modal travel hubs

The findings, recommendations and comprehensive data will feed into CAT's 'Go between' activity, a community travel advice desk that is under consideration, upgrade CAT's website, exhibitions, transport stalls, telephone enquiries, newsletters, and events.

Benefits to the Community

- •Improve accessibility for all residents in the area.
- •Ensure that travel opportunities are as near 24/7 as possible
- •Improve their career prospects, and social opportunities for young people
- •Offer travel opportunities other than the car
- •Raise awareness of environmental impact of traffic and transport
- •Strengthen the links between community sectors by joint working

Numbers of beneficiaries

The whole community area is targeted: 20,000.

There are 15.5% non-car households, 42.2% one-car households. This amounts to some 4,413 households or over 10,000 individuals with travel needs that might not be met by the private car.
