Analysing comment is not an exact science and some things – such as expressions of sympathy cannot be quantified. Therefore the figures below only contain what could be counted, issues that people felt needed consideration, possible solutions, what they felt was important etc. Where it was not clearly stated or obvious that people supported or opposed closure, did not mind or had no particularly opinion – in fact where it was unclear, no figure is given.
