The public will be able to engage with this activity in a number of ways, both immediately and in the long term. The overall aim of the project is to make poetry accessible to as many members of the community as possible, encouraging people of all age groups, abilities and backgrounds to creatively use and enjoy the written word. They will be able to engage as an audience by listening to poetry performances and actively participate by taking part in workshops – both written and performance - and master classes, as well as enter competitions, perform their own work and contribute to an exhibition. In addition to work with schools generally, part of the residency will be aimed at children with disabilities; children will be able to work individually, in pairs or in a group, one of the key aims being to use poetry as a way of helping the children to engage with their emotions. The benefits of performance include helping to raise confidence and communication skills. A further part of the residency will be to encourage adults with learning disabilities to explore words, their ambiguities and the way in which they are used to effect in the poetic form. Work with people suffering from mental illness will also be a feature of the initiative. In addition, the residency will include a performance to take place in the Wiltshire Literature Festival 2010 and an event to mark World Book Day in March. We would be aiming at approximately a thousand participants throughout the year.

The Residency is time limited, so it would not continue after the year was finished. However, it is hoped that various types of poetry groups may be formed as a result and these would be supported, in kind, by the library service in Warminster.

The project has the support, through grants, of Warminster Town Council, The Peter Gough Foundation and The Fudge Trust. While the Residency will be aimed at the general public, there are specific groups we would like to particularly benefit from the initiative: Adults with disabilities, (physical and learning), children, people suffering from mental health problems, where the therapeutic aspect of writing and reading poetry can be particularly beneficial,						
and people excluded from reading due to sight difficulties. We intend to work with the Warminster & Westbury Blind club, The White Horse Stroke Club, MIND, WAVE and Warminster Mencap and Gateway in these particular areas. (The Residency was originally suggested by a member of the Warminster Library Readers Group at the						
presentation ceremony for the Year of Reading short story competition, last year.) One of the Poets has already been appointed, (the second will be confirmed shortly). Chris Tutton is a popular workshop leader and performer, one of his workshops being cited by BBC executives as a "perfect example of a successful collaboration between						
he BBC and the library service." He has had several successful events at Warminster Library in the past and has						
appeared at many literature festivals throughout Britain.
