### Annual Healthcheck - Results 2006/07

## **Purpose of Report**

- 1. To inform the committee of the results of the Annual Healthcheck process for 2006/07 carried out by the Healthcare Commission for all Trusts in England.
- 2. To establish a process for the committee to gather information in order to provide comments for the six main Trusts serving the population of Wiltshire for 2007/08.

## **Background**

- 3. The Annual Healthcheck results have now been published for all trusts in England for the year 2006/07 and appear further in this report.
- 4. Health Overview and Scrutiny Committees (OSCs) are requested by the Healthcare Commission to provide comments for the trusts in their area, although it is not obligatory. The Wiltshire Health OSC has always seen this as an opportunity to learn more about the work of a trust and to contribute positively to the process by which trusts are monitored.

#### Results for 2006/07

- 5. The results for this year's Annual Healthcheck were published on 18 October for each Primary Care Trust and NHS Trust in England. The results for the six main trusts serving residents of Wiltshire are set out in the table below, along with the results from last year where applicable.
- 6. Previous years results are not available for Wiltshire Primary Care Trust and Great Western Ambulance Service because they were created following mergers in 2006.
- 7. More detailed information for each score is available and will be provided to members who are focussing on particular trusts for next year's Annual Healthcheck.
- 8. The results for this year show little overall change from last year, although in some cases there have been slight improvements or declines.

9. Significantly for Swindon & Marlborough NHS Trust it has improved its Use of Resources score from "weak" to "good", which has enabled it to apply for Foundation Trust status, as use of resources is a key factor in the eligibility criteria for this process.
