Route 1 – approaching the Bradford Area from Batheaston



There is a weight restriction warning sign at Solsbury Hill on the A46 which I could not read when driving by, nor could I find a safe pleace to photograph it. Then ...

Coming from the A46 this is the next indication to Bradford on Avon

Closely followed by the second sign, with the **17 tonnes M.G.W. Weight Restriction**, which I could not read at a "normal" speed of approach to this junction

 \prec Closely followed by the third direction sign :


... with no hint of a limit as you leave the roundabout heading for Bradford \geq

Then up through Sally in the Woods towards Bradford on the A363



This is the first Bradford sign, near Cumberwell Golf Course

... closely followed by this lovely, large, graphic sign neatly combines information about the limit with route information in the same sign . . . albeit that the limit stated is inconsistent with other



< And then the second **Bradford** sign

✓ Then immediately a sign I found quite confusing, and partly obscured by vegetation,, closely followed by . . .

> ... a profusion of signs at the junction itself: a new sort of black sign (presumably a preferred route for lorries) and a partly obscured sign to Frome: "Route for light vehicles".



Approaching the final opportunity to turn away from the town centre, the route sign is silent about the weight restriction and a separate sign is obscured by the pedestrian crossing and by vegetation \forall
