Consequently the committee agreed to commission a task group to give further attention to the following major aspects of the school food strategy: (a) the government's nutrient based standards, and the challenges they posed (b) how many secondary and special schools in Wiltshire would need to make plans to build or share modern food technology facilities and equipment (c) what is the general impact of making learning to cook and understand the principles of diet and nutrition, an entitlement for 11-18 year olds (d) the principles underlying the new school catering contract, particularly to see how best to secure buy-in from schools, to gain a better appreciation of the demand for alternative school food delivery methods, and to gain a better appreciation of what alternative school food delivery methods will be possible for schools in the future (e) the role of the Schools Forum in promoting the school food strategy."
