Parents bring their children from as far away as Malmesbury to use the equipment. The surfaces are currently forest bark which over the years has become worn out, waterlogged and weed-ridden. Cats mess in it and it has been subject to vandalism by teenagers breaking bottles and children getting cut on the glass. Children now get splinters from the wood chip and scratched by the thistles now growing in it and the committee is fighting a losing battle on controlling the weeds (see attached photographs). In spite of this, the play area is used as a family meeting place, picnic area and gathering place and at weekends, after school in the summer and during school holidays as many as 20 youngsters can be using the equipment at any one time as it is the most popular children's activity in the village. (Attached photographs 1-2 shows typical holiday and weekend usage by the community.) NWDC will not meet future running costs for projects.
