## 3. Background Information

## Call-In and Urgency

3.1 The call-in procedure shall not apply where the decision being taken by the Executive is urgent. A decision will be urgent if any delay likely to be caused by the call-in process would seriously prejudice the Council's or the public's interests. The record of the decision shall state whether in the opinion of the decision-making person or body, the decision is an urgent one, and therefore not subject to call-in. The Chairman of the Council and the Chairman of the Overview and Scrutiny Committee must agree both that the decision proposed is reasonable in all the circumstances and to it being treated as a matter of urgency. In the absence of either Chairman, the relevant Vice-Chairman's consent shall be required. In the absence of the required combination of individual members, the Head of Paid Service or his/her nominee's consent shall be required. Decisions taken as a matter of urgency must be reported to the next available meeting of the Council, together with the reasons for urgency.

#### 4. Decisions Taken not Subject to Call-In

4.1 As at the date of this report, three decisions which were not subject to the call-in process have been taken by the Executive. Details of these decisions are set out below:

Pay and Display Parking Charges (Min. No. E194, 6 March 2007)

- 1) That the charges outlined in the revised Appendix 1 (attached to the Minutes) are advertised and implemented as from 2<sup>nd</sup> April 2007 with the exception of the proposed charges for the Newlands Road Car Park, Corsham and Borough Fields Car Park, Wootton Bassett which are adopted for consultation as required under the terms of the management agreements applicable to each car park.
- 2) In accordance with the Council's Constitution the Executive consider this decision to be urgent and not subject to call in as any delay caused by the call-in process would prejudice the Council's and public's interest.

Leisure Provision in Calne and Cricklade (Min. No. E196, 6 March 2007):

- 1. To the release of £60,000 to the Cricklade Community Association subject to the provision of additional information required by the Legal Services Team Leader and to the tenant agreeing to surrender the lease to the Council on terms to be agreed by the Legal Services Team Leader should the centre continue to be financially non-viable.
- 2. That leisure staff (former NWLL employees), who are currently employed by the Council, are given the option to transfer to the Cricklade Community Association on their existing terms and conditions of employment, under TUPE

regulations, as appropriate.

- that the Council underwrites the redundancy costs (based on the Leisure Centre redundancy agreement) should staff who TUPE to the Cricklade Community Association be made redundant as a consequence of the centre ceasing to be financially viable within 12 months from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2007.
- That in accordance with the Council's Constitution the Executive considers these decisions to be urgent, and not subject to call in, as any delay caused by the call-in process would seriously prejudice the Council's or the public's interest.
- To note that negotiations are continuing with regard to the White Horse Leisure Centre in Calne and that a report will be submitted to the Executive on 15<sup>th</sup> March 2007.
