| Organisation | Purpose | Amount Recommended |

| Charities Information Bureau (CIB) | CIB provides an important service to community and voluntary groups by supporting new groups through the charity registration process. In addition it offers wide ranging funding advice and support to organisations and local community groups to enable them to seek funding from a range of sources other than those provided by the Council. This service supports the Council's Community Awards Scheme and provides access to other funding streams, thus ensuring the viability of numerous schemes which support the delivery of the Community Plans. | £1500 |
| Community Foundation | The Community Foundation provides a grant-making programme for groups and charities working to address social inclusion and community benefit. This funding helps to lever out funding opportunities for a range of community projects across the district. | £1000 |
| Solve | This funding helps to lever out funding opportunities for a range of small grants for community groups e.g. research and feasibility studies, training and equipment hire or purchase. | £1500 |
| Sports Aid South West | This organisation supports talented young sports people, which enables NWDC to signpost applications for individual sport support rather than funding through Community Area Awards. | £300 |
| Vitalise | Vitalise is a national charity that providing short breaks for disabled people and their carers, which includes a number from North Wiltshire. | £500 |
| Samaritans | The Samaritans provide advice and support to people across Wiltshire 365 days a year. | £578 |
| Cruse Bereavement Care | Cruse bereavement care offers 1:1 bereavement counselling as well as hosting a range of specialist groups in order for people to understand their grief and cope with their loss. | £578 |
