What is the Community benefit of your project, and approximately how many people will benefit? To create a Community Garden for the use of all residents (4,850) and visitors (6,000+) to Cricklade. The garden will include the following elements: A circular paved area including 3 flagpoles, on which commemorative flags from local and international organisations can be flown. It will also provide a safe area to be used by a variety of organisations within the town to mark key local events and national celebrations and an area for the performing arts, schools and charitable organisations and the Town Band. A circular mosaic area that will be created by using designs and labour from many organisations in the town including the schools, scouts, guides, playgroups, WI, churches etc. Floral Beds. 'Interpretation Board' to explain the location, and construction of Cricklade Saxon ramparts which abut the proposed garden. A permanent location for growing a 'Christmas fir tree'. This garden will provide a haven of tranquillity where people of all ages can sit, relax and converse. Attract visitors to improve the economic viability of a small market town. The creation of the mosaic involving residents of all ages will create civic pride. Involvement of organisations within the town to help maintain the planted areas also create a sense of 'ownership'. All residents and visitors to Cricklade will benefit from the creation of a Community Garden either directly by its use or by passing by a more attractive High Street. The elderly and disabled will be able to easily access the facility and be able to sit and converse with others breaking out from their isolation.

3 – Additional information to support and strengthen your application e.g. consultation, community involvement, energy efficiency measures

It has been identified that Cricklade is short of public open spaces. The enhancement of this land, owned by North Wiltshire District Council, would be of benefit to the community.

Requests from members of the community for the creation of a community garden and the Royal British Legion, to provide a flag flying space for the flags the Town Council has been honoured to receive. This prompted Cricklade Town Council to engage a landscape designer with the aim of promoting social well-being and psychological health. A feasibility study was prepared to address these issues. Following the production of the study, an exhibit of the proposed garden was displayed in the Town Council office and a public meeting was also held to gauge the view of residents. The Cricklade Business Association that represents the business community always welcomes initiatives that improve tourism to help retain the small shops within the town.

Community groups throughout the town of all ages will have the opportunity to take part in the design and creation of the community mosaic. This will give representatives of mixed ages opportunity to work together to create a project in which they will take pride and 'ownership'.

The borders around the paved area could be planted and cared for by local community groups, e.g. Cricklade Bloomers, Youth Groups, W. I. and local children.

The design of the garden ensures it will be fully accessible to the disabled.

This is a project that can grow with the town and its organisations, as there is room for further development and expansion within the boundaries of the garden.
