Exhibit 1 - Graph showing 2008/09 Capital Programme by Theme

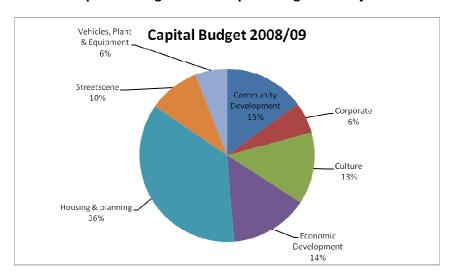
