#### 5. Community based projects in support of the Credit Crunch

5.1. In response to the current economic crisis and credit crunch that people and communities in North Wiltshire are facing the following projects were supported with funding from the Executive.

## North Wiltshire Citizens Advice Bureau £38,000 to provide enhance Debt Case work Advice

North Wilts CAB are currently recruiting an additional debt case worker to be able to meet the increased demand for such support from North Wiltshire residents. The case worker will operate predominantly from the CAB offices in Calne (based in the area of greatest need) and will be available for appointments other offices or home visits if clients cannot access any of the CABs offices. The provision of this additional resource will mean that the CAB will be able to meet the needs of those in need.

## North Wiltshire Credit Union £6,000 to facilitate a bills payment service and

Grant for a shop based location in Chippenham including £4,000 to fit out

There is a call nationally to support Credit Unions, the grant provided to the Credit Union will mean that they will be able to operate a bills payment service for their members to enable then them to pay bills by direct debit where they may have previously been unable to do so through a lack of bank facilities. This service means that the Credit Union will be able to work alongside debt management advice services such as the CAB to support local resident to more effectively manage their debt and their money. In addition to this funding a further grant has been provided to provide the required rent for a shop in Redlands in Chippenham. With a small sum to get the facility ready the Credit Union will begin to operate from a shop premises in one of the areas of greatest need in the District. Officers from the Credit Union have already begun to explore what other advice and support services could operate from the same premises and are in discussion with the CAB and Westlea.

## 7. Energy Efficiency Awards Scheme Overview

- 7.1. All 34 facilities awarded funds in principle submitted the required quotes to by the 19th December deadline. This allowed officers to review the actual quotes against the estimated figures and confirm final awards to applicants. There has been some variance from the original guideline figures contained in the audits with actual quotes coming in both under and over the original projections. This has been for a number of reasons; for example upon invasive investigation (which was not included in the original audit) some facilities did not require cavity wall insulations as it was already there. This is something that cannot be determined without the invasive investigation and was a real possibility highlighted in the audits. Converse to that Members will be interested to note that the costs of the roof insulation were considerably more than first projected this was in the main due to the complex and invasive nature of the works.
- 7.2. With all the quotes taken into consideration the increased costs (when compared to the original estimates) in some areas have been offset by the lower costs in other areas. All improvements approved by the Executive back in July have secured the required levels of funding inline with approved quotes.
- 7.3. There have been some facilities where the works have proven to be more complicated or the process of making the improvements has required listed building consent.
- 7.4. One facility has withdrawn from the scheme and declined their award of £1,000.

#### 8. Delivery

- 8.1. A progress check list for each location is included in the table on the following pages.
- 8.2. In many cases local builders have already been used or currently contracted by the community facilities to undertake the works. An advertisement was placed in the

Gazette and Herald and information was put on the Council's website. The response to this was good with callers requesting details of the community facilities and information about the type of works that needed to be done. A real success to this project overall that much of the work has been undertaken by local businesses. Some local businesses that delivered some of the improvement works early on in the scheme have since gone on to successfully quote for work at other facilities benefitting from the scheme.

- 8.3. All applicants are aware that they must draw down funds by 6th March to allow us to release funding before the end of the Financial Year.
- 8.4. The most complicated applications involve those requiring Listed Building Consent (the Marden House Centre, Purton Village Hall, Lacock Village Hall and Cricklade Jenner Hall). Officers remain optimistic that the funded improvements will be delivered.

## 9. Budget Forecast - Overall Project Budget

- 9.1. The District Council originally committed to awards totalling £420,800. Current budget forecasts indicate that this actual figure is likely to be £420,287.
- 9.2. There was an original tolerated variance / contingency budget of £26,950. Although there are still some questions over the final costs of works at those facilities where there are listed building consent issues there was a forecasted underspend of £27,462.

- 9.3. It has been necessary to retain a contingency budget (there have been some unforeseen related works (e.g. removal of asbestos, fireguards where additional safety protection is needed for children, changes to quotes due to amendments made by Listed Building Officers).
- 9.4. In January Members consented to an award of £15,187 to Wiltshire Wood Recycling for the provision of a new gas powered truck to a project that sees useable and recyclable wood diverted from land fill.

## 10. Other Energy Audits

10.1. In addition to providing audits for Cricklade and Calne Leisure Centres, Rudloe Community Centre and The Pound Arts Centre, NWDC has offered all 6 Town Councils energy audits and meters for one of their community buildings. Each Council is aware that this will not be followed up with further funding, but recognise the value of the expert advice in the audit and the benefit of the energy efficiency meter to monitor consumption. Severn Wye will undertake these audits during March.

## 11. Publicity
