The Chairman of the Council, Councillor Mrs Chettleburgh was also in attendance and spoke at minute 14.

Apologies: Councillor B Dalton (Community and Housing)

At the invitation of the Chairman Councillor Westmoreland advised in respect of agenda item 14, that he wished to see the current scheme continue to be implemented.

6 Declarations of Interest:

Councillor Sample declared a personal and prejudicial interest in respect of the urgent item concerning the office project and left the meeting during discussion thereon.

7 Minutes of Last Meeting:

The minutes of the special meeting held on 31 May 2007 were approved as a correct record and signed by the Chairman.

8 Public Question and Statement Time:

Statements were presented from Mr T West and Ms Wright concerning agenda item 7 (attached as **Annex A** and **B** to the minutes). The Leader advised that the black box collection for rural households would be introduced at the same time as the rest of the scheme and not Autumn 2008 as suggested by Ms Wright. Councillor West and Mr Duller also addressed the Cabinet on matters concerning item 7. The Leader announced that answers to the various points raised would be addressed during the presentation and Cabinet debate on this matter.

The Leader also advised that the dates for the Special Cabinet and Full Council meetings to deal with the office project following the consultation exercise would be held on 23 July and 25 July respectively.

9 Forward Plan:

The Leader presented his Forward Plan for the period 1 July 2007 – 31 October 2007 (previously circulated) to be published and become operational from 1 July 2007.

Agreed - that the Leader's Forward Plan 1 July 2007 to 31 October 2007, be adopted for publication as amended below - the revised plan is attached as an **annex C** to these minutes.

11 Review of Cabinet Portfolio Responsibilities:

The Leader introduced the previously circulated report of the Head of Democratic Services.

Recommended - to Full Council on 25 June 2007 -

- that the proposals set out in section 3 of the report be approved as regards the new portfolio and deputy portfolio arrangements, except that the "Budget and Finance" portfolio shall instead be titled "Finance".
- 2. that paragraph 1.9 under the Cabinet's powers within the Constitution be altered to reflect the change in Portfolio arrangements;
- 3. the Independent Remuneration Panel be requested to review the Members' Allowances Scheme to take account of these changes and also re examine the allowances paid to the Independent Persons serving on the Standards and Audit Committees in view of the increasingly demanding role of the Chairmanship and Vice-Chairmanship positions on these two bodies.

- (1) that as regards the Officers' Scheme of Delegation, and the special delegation arrangements under Part 6 of the Constitution paragraph 1.1, as the concept of deputy Portfolio Holders is to be retained, albeit under different arrangements, it is not envisaged that any changes need to be made to that particular section; and
- (2) the Portfolio holders have undertaken to forego £2,217 of their allowance as set out in the report pending the outcome of the Remuneration Panel's review

12 Corporate Plan and Best Value Performance Plan:

The Leader introduced the previously circulated report of the Acting Chief Executive.

14 Review of Household Waste - Alternate Week Collection Scheme:

The Leader introduced the previously circulated report of the Head of Environmental Services and noted the views of the City Area Community Committee an extract minute of which was circulated at the meeting. Mr Darbyshire, Waste and Street Services Manager in Environmental Services gave the Cabinet a detailed presentation on the scheme and subsequently answered various questions on matters of concern. Mr Darbyshire recognised that solutions needed to be found in some areas within the District and within certain types of property where wheelie bins may not be suitable. In respect of Council flats/group dwellings, housing staff were working closely with residents to meet their needs eg relocate community bin areas. Also where wheelie bins were not practical, sacks for recycling material to an equivalent capacity of the bins would be provided. He advised that residents had a key role to play in managing their waste and also explained that whilst some authorities had experienced an increase in fly tipping as of result of implementing such changes, it had been very modest.

The Cabinet noted that all of the ten top collection authorities operated an alternate week collection service. The report indicates that 7 from the top 10 are using AWC but this has since been updated. Explanations were also given by the Officer in respect of the treatment of plastic bottles, the size of wheelie bins, and green waste issues. Concern was expressed about how alternate collections could cope with the demands of those whose medical needs create substantial amounts of disposable material.

The Leader considered that the former administration had failed to consult adequately with local residents on this scheme, and that the concerns expressed by Councillors in the rural areas about their particular issues needed to be addressed. Also there was a pressing need to publish information about which properties would be provided with an alternative to wheeled bins. He felt a wider community debate and fuller consultation on the way forward for recycling, including seeking the views of all ward councillors (including on which houses were suitable to be provided with a wheelie bin), parish councillors and relevant groups was needed so that an informed decision on this vital issue can be taken. The Leader, having consulted the Head of Environmental Services about the viability of delaying this process for two months to enable such consultation to take place, moved what was agreed below.

Aareed: that

- (1) A decision to continue with the implementation of this scheme be deferred pending further community consultation (details below) and the Officers inform the contractors accordingly and seek an extra two months latitude from them to enable this to happen;
- (2) the consultation arrangements include seeking the views of all district councillors on the options and on which houses are suitable for the provision of wheelie bins, as they are best placed to know the situation in their respective areas (providing them with a further copy of the Cabinet report); all parish and town councils in the district and relevant interested bodies including: the National Health Service via the Patient Advisory Liaison

Service; community residents and tenants organisations; environmental groups (including the Green Party and Agenda 21) using the council website, the local media (including Salisbury Journal, Spire FM, BBC Wiltshire Sound, Valley News and Blackmore Vale Magazine);

- (3) In addition to the Cabinet report, consultation be by way of open letter/leaflet, detailing the options available (and associated costs) including a high quality kerb side scheme but excluding the status quo which is not an option such letter/leaflet shall be approved by the Leader and Deputy Leader prior to use;
- (4) The local area committees and the Environment and Transport Overview and Scrutiny Panel be invited to examine the matter further and submit its views to Cabinet:
- (5) That the outcome of this consultation exercise be reported to Cabinet/Council as necessary so regard can be had to it prior to a decision on the way forward being taken;
- (6) Which ever scheme the Cabinet decides to proceed with, it be heralded by a comprehensive marketing campaign to be agreed by the Cabinet;
- (7) That the Officers devise an appeals mechanism for local residents who do not feel able to accommodate wheeled bins such mechanism will involve Members.

15 Corporate Consultation Project – Context Report:

The Cabinet considered the previously circulated report of the Planning Officer.

Agreed – that the contents of the report be noted and that the formal consultation report, 'Salisbury and South Wiltshire - Our Place in the Future' be brought back to Cabinet at the 11 July meeting for authorisation to commence the formal consultation process.

Agreed - that

- (2) Members be appointed to the Outside Bodies in accordance with the schedule attached as an annex D to these minutes.

19 Re-Establishment of the Joint Consultative Forum:

Agreed – that the Joint Consultative Forum be re-established, in accordance the previously circulated terms of reference, subject to the following minor changes - paragraph 8 replace "branch administrator" with "branch organiser" and replace "T & GWU" in paragraph 4ii and paragraph 8 with "Unite".

20 Housing Revenue Account Planned Maintenance Programme 2007/08:

The Cabinet considered the previously circulated report of the Head of Housing Management.

Agreed – that the draft planned maintenance programme in the sum of £3,858,960 be approved – the details of which are contained under exempt business.

21 Exempt Information:

22 Matter of Urgency: Possible Land Appropriation - Bourne Hill

The Deputy Leader, in the chair for this item, agreed to take the following matter under urgent business as a decision needed to be taken before the next scheduled meeting -

Agreed - that

- (1) the following decision be recorded in open business, but the debate surrounding it remain as exempt business.
- (2) pursuant to any work that may be undertaken at Bourne Hill, to approve the taking of all necessary steps to pursue the appropriation of the walled garden, the strip of land between the northern boundary of the walled garden and the access road to College Street car park and the area of land between the eastern boundary of the walled garden and the access running along the eastern side of Bourne Hill and that a further report be brought back to Cabinet on 23 July 2007 for a decision by Cabinet on whether to appropriate or not.
- (3) a detailed explanation as to why the preliminary action at (2) above is required to safeguard the Council's interests, be produced and made available to all concerned groups;
- (4) Officers be instructed to investigate all other options available to protect the use of the green space surrounding Bourne Hill, including the viability of the Council submitting a village green application and/or placing it in the management or ownership of a community trust.

Statement to Cabinet on 13 June 2007 -

Agenda Item 7 'Review of Refuse Collection/Recycling Arrangements'

Putrescrible waste is the material most householders will experience problems managing if this AWC system is implemented. In 2002 WCC produced the document "waste management in Wiltshire and Swindon" which was used during their round of public consultations. This clearly showed a waste disposal hierarchy with landfill at the bottom and composting in the middle. Unfortunately in the last five years no facilities have been built in the county to deal with the growing problem of food waste. In 2005 a £100,000 DEFRA grant was used to commission an analysis of the county's waste, this clearly shows that 40% is Putrescrible forming the overwhelmingly largest portion of our black bag waste.

Under the proposed AWC system this valuable material once mixed with residual waste will initially be land filled and eventually in 2008 be incinerated.

I have written a response to the discussion paper `living in the country', the draft report I believe will be coming to cabinet in July. Under the heading "Treating the Causes of Decline" you suggest agricultural diversification with appropriate levels of support could be part of this solution. Suitable sites locally need to be identified and partnerships encouraged to create on-farm anaerobic digestion facilities, where methane gas is harnessed and converted into renewable energy. The residual waste is then used as a fertilizer helping to reduce reliance on chemical inputs. Local farms rather than international companies will then benefit financially from the disposal gate fees.

These suggestions are all in line with recent central Government announcements which said every household should have a slop bucket to be recycled in exactly this way.

If SDC fail to implement a facility to collect this material for recycling they will suffer justified criticism when the `pay as you throw' system is introduced. Housholders will have no choice other than depositing this material in their residual waste bin, increasing their weekly charge.

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Summary of statement to Salisbury District Council cabinet meeting 13 June 2007

- This statement relates to item 7 on the agenda Review of Refuse Collection/Recycling Arrangements
- We are not opposed in principle to alternate week collections AWCs, however we have a number of concerns about the particular scheme developed by the previous administration as it currently stands
- Rural households will not be getting a black box collection until autumn 2008 and instead
 are expected to themselves take bottles, cans etc to household recycling centres. This is
 grossly unfair and indeed could be argued to be in breach of the council's duty to provide a
 household waste collection service.
- The report does not explain how the new national targets for recycling and composting of 40/45/50% by 2010/15/20 can be achieved with a scheme which only expects to eventually achieve 34%. We observe that 2010 is within the expected life of the current administration.
- Changing the garden waste collection scheme from individually purchased brown bags to an annually charged bin is inequitable with regard to residents on lower incomes.
 Households who do not wish/cannot afford to rent a garden waste bin will now have reduced opportunities to recycle.
- We are strongly opposed to households being encouraged to put putresible waste (cooked food, pet bedding etc) into a residual waste bin. This type of waste should be collected separately and sent for anaerobic digestion which both recovers useful energy and also produces a safe and useful final product (fertiliser).
- Tonbridge & Malling Borough Council collects a green lidded bin on alternate weeks but householders are also permitted to put putresible waste into the residual waste collection if they have concerns about flies etc during hot weather. Such an arrangement while perhaps not ideal, both increases composting, offering the possibility of meeting the 40/45/50% targets and also meets residents' main concern about AWCs.
- We would like to see households being offered a choice of size of bin (ie smaller than 180l) and we think the bins should be lockable.
- We strongly agree that the success of any scheme relies heavily on appropriate public
 education and agree that this needs to be improved. Increasing waste management staff
 on the ground to help and advise individual householders is certainly and important part of
 this. We would argue that imagination is also needed; Teignbridge District Council
 introduced AWCs with a vigorous campaign including using and monitoring the local
 media, stalls at fairs, competitions and visits to community based groups such as church
 groups, WI, guides and scouts etc.
