Subject : Temporary appropriation of land surrounding the Former Swimming Pool Site

Purpose of report:

1.1 To seek approval to commence the procedure for the proposed appropriation of land surrounding the Old Swimming Pool on a temporary basis to facilitate the demolition of the building.

1. Background:

- 2.1 Officers recommend to Cabinet that the building be demolished as soon as practical. Conservation Area Consent has been obtained and Tenders for the work received.
- 2.2 Local members, in particular, will be aware of the sustained attempts to break-in to the building, high levels of vandalism and instances of graffiti. The ongoing costs of making good are considerable and a constant drain on resources. A recent exercise at the request of the Leader to examine the feasibility of bringing the building back into use concluded that it was not financially viable to do so.
- 2.3 The area of the proposed temporary land appropriation is shown on the plan at Appendix 1 and contains approximately 5300 square meters. The site includes the building, a working area around it, site access and two tree protection zones. For Health & Safety reasons it will be necessary to exclude public access from the area during the course of the works.

3. The appropriation process:

3.1. Notice of the Council's intention to consider appropriation would be placed in the Salisbury Journal for two consecutive weeks on the 13th & 20th September and no later than the 13th details would appear on the Council's website. The closing date for written representations would be the 5th October.









Awarded in: Housing Services Waste and Recycling Services 3.2. A report containing a summary of any representations received would be considered by Cabinet on the 10th October with a view to Cabinet deciding to appropriate or to decline to appropriate as the case may be.

Cabinet is recommended to instruct Officers to commence the process of land appropriation on a temporary basis
