





Actions against domestic violence - the percentage of the questions in the 'definition' box to which the local authority can answer 'yes'








PI 572 - Accommodation bookings taken by the TIC (Salisbury District Council) This Year to Date (Last Value)




BVPI 084 b - Reduction in Waste Arisings (Salisbury District Council) This Year to Date (Last Value)




**BVPI 199 d - Fly-Tipping (Salisbury** District Council)






PI 504 b - AH units granted PP (Salisbury District Council) This Year to Date (Last Value)
















