*Legal Implications

Generally it is unlawful to hold a fair other than as granted under the Charter.

On application to the Ministry of Justice under Section 6 of The Fairs Act the Secretary of State can grant an order "that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public" and approve extra days.

The Ministry have indicated that it would not concern itself with a "one off extra day".

Legal advice is that some of the formal process should be considered i.e. consultation.

Consultation was undertaken during the Fair of 2007.

Showmen and Guild - Mostly in favour

Public - Mostly ambivalent

City Centre Business – conducted by City Centre Management indicated 80% against the proposal a view supported by City Centre Management.

**Financial Implications

The policy is for the Fair to operate at cost neutral to Salisbury District Council inclusive of all actual and associated costs. This has been implemented for other occasions i.e. Millennium when an extra day has occurred. Therefore there is no financial implication.

***Environmental Implications

Arrangements are in hand with Environmental Health to conduct air quality test at this years Fair to educate future decisions and policies.
