

Successes of the Council

Statutory consultation on Salisbury parishing project attracted 3000 responses from city residents.

Salisbury has been granted Fairtrade City status by the Fairtrade Foundation.

Durrington residents can drop in to an open consultation event on 10 July to hear about police and local council efforts to tackle ant-social behaviour in the town.

Salisbury District Council will provide nearly £24,000 to Age Concern so that it can continue to provide a handyperson service to older people and those with a disability in privately rented or owned accommodation.

Salisbury District Council is working with a local primary school to improve the safety and sustainability of pupils' journey to school by allowing one of its car parks to be used as the starting point for a 'walking bus'. Also, a Salisbury walking map project has been cited as an example of good practice in a new government publication.

Salisbury District Council held a special open day to promote the range of options open to people looking for an affordable home in south Wiltshire.

Salisbury District Council has awarded over £100,000 to 13 community groups in the first tranche of grants to be made from the new General Community Fund set up earlier this year.
