RESOLVED – that the above application be approved subject to the following conditions:

- I. The development hereby permitted shall be begun before the expiration of five years from the date of this permission.

Reason: To comply with the provisions of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990

2. The materials to be used in the construction of the external surfaces of the extension hereby permitted shall match those used in the existing building.

Reason: To ensure that the proposed extension will satisfactorily harmonise with the external appearance of the existing building.

3. There shall be no windows on the side elevation of the extension hereby permitted.

Reason: To ensure adequate privacy for the occupants of neighbouring premises.

4. The garage shown on the approved drawing shall not be converted into a habitable room without the permission of the Local Planning Authority upon submission of a planning application on that behalf.

Reason: To secure the retention of adequate off-street car parking provision.
