Criminal Procedure and Investigations Act 1996

The code of practice issued under Part II of the Criminal Procedure and Investigations Act (CPIA) only applies to criminal investigations.

This appendix gives some guidance on the code of practice, but it is advised that officers refer to the code of practice.

It deals with the disclosure of evidence which may undermine the prosecution case, and identifies three roles within investigations.

- 1. <u>Investigating Officer</u> (**IO**) Directly involved with the conduct of the investigation, pursues all reasonable lines of enquiry and gives reasons for actions.
- Officer in charge of investigation (OIC) Officer responsible for the investigation. Must ensure that investigation is in accordance with CPIA, and that all material that may be relevant to the investigation is retained and made available to the Disclosure Officer.
- Disclosure Officer (DO) Responsible for examining the evidence, revealing material to the prosecutor and disclosing material to the accused at the request of the prosecutor.

In addition, the code identifies the types of material that must be disclosed. Material includes information and objects that are obtained during the course of an investigation which may effect the case.

- 1. Sensitive material material which the DO believes is not in the public interest to reveal (eg. informants details and ongoing covert surveillance).
- 2. Non sensitive material which officers are under a duty to disclose.
- 3. Unused sensitive and non-sensitive material should also be recorded on the file.


The code places a duty to disclose material which may undermine the case against the accused (**Primary Disclosure**).

It also demands that material which may assist the defence be revealed (**Secondary Prosecution Disclosure**)
