Purpose

To amend the current Constitution and Scheme of Delegation to Officers.

Background

The Cabinet on the 4 July 2007 received a report (copy of that report is attached at Appendix `A`) concerning new grant arrangements for historic buildings and areas. This involved a withdrawal from the current Historic Buildings Joint Committees (HBJCs) and the creation of a District-wide grant scheme that required the Planning Policy and Conservation Services Manager to be authorised to approve grant payments as set out in that report.

The new arrangements will engage with town and parish councils through the establishment of an informal Partnership Panel. This will meet periodically to consider projects of mutual concern. Grant funding, either individually or in partnership, will be at the discretion of the constituent councils.

The purpose of this report is therefore:-

- (a) to seek approval from Council to remove the references to HBJCs from the Constitution after expiry of the notice period; that is from 30 September 2007.
- (b) to seek authorisation for the Planning Policy and Conservation Services Manager to authorise grant payments, in consultation with the Portfolio Holder, up to a limit of £10,000 in any individual case.

Key Issues

To make amendments to the Constitution to remove references to the HBJCs and authorise the Planning Policy and Conservation Services Manager to approve grant payments.
