Purpose

The purpose of this report is to provide details of the work undertaken by the Audit Committee during the year April 2008 to March 2009.

Background

The Audit Committee has been operating since April 2006. It has responsibility to examine the effectiveness of the authority's internal and external audit functions, reviewing risk management and the proper financial management of the Authority.

The committee makes reports and other recommendations to Council and/or Cabinet in connection with the above and the improvement of the authority's services.

The Audit Committee has a forward work plan, which is regularly reviewed and updated. In developing the forward work plan the Chairman and Vice Chairman of the committee meet with the Corporate Director (Chief Finance Officer) to review current and future issues.

The Committee consists of seven members and meets on a quarterly basis. It met on three occasions during the year. The attendance figures show that three members attended all three meetings and the majority of members attended two thirds or more of the meetings held.

The Audit Committee would like to thank all members who have contributed their time and effort to the work of the Committee.

Key Issues

The Committee considered a range of items during the year, a summary of the main areas is given below:

Statutory Financial Statements

The committee reviewed and approved the Annual governance Statement, which forms part of the Statement of Accounts. This describes the control environment in operation for the year of the accounts. Members considered the accuracy and fairness of representation of the control environment and the significant control issues. Progress on dealing with the significant control issues was reported to future meetings.

The Statement of Accounts (subject to audit) for the financial year ended 31 March 2008 was approved after robust examination and challenge.
