Dear Committee member,

I write to inform you of that the original plans for the project named above have rather fallen apart due to the company who were to provide the service no longer being available for this work. While unfortunate, it may be that what I now propose may meet your requirements to provide services for young people in the Northern area even better than the original plan.

What I now suggest is that a company called Vita Nova based in Christchurch Road Bournemouth provide a drama concerning issues of drug use and addiction followed by a group discussion.

This group has been suggested to me by Dawne Doors of Wiltshire Youth Outreach as being an excellent provider of drama which will engage young people in real problems that surround them. She is especially keen that the young people of the area should have access to opportunities to discuss problems of drug and alcohol use and abuse at a time when schools are withdrawing funding from these areas of Personal, Social and Health Education.

Rather than only a small group benefiting from such a plan I suggest that I approach a local secondary school, possibly Stonehenge School with whom I have forged links in the past year. If this were not possible, youth groups at Durrington/ Amesbury could be approached.

I look forward to hearing your views.
