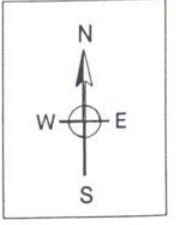

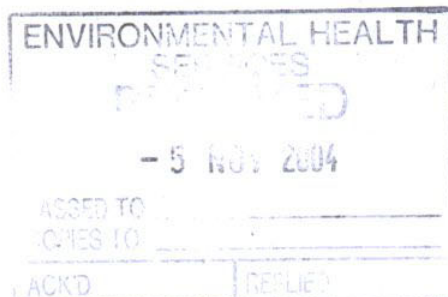

RE: Kings Arms & Riggsy's Nightclub

Thank you for your letter of 28th September 2004 requesting our observations and comments on the Conditions imposed upon the above Public Entertainment License by the Northern Area Committee at its April Meeting.

I have consulted with the Chief Inspector and officers at Amesbury, our comments and observations at today's date are as follows.

It would appear that since the implementation of the conditions imposed by the committee there have been fewer reported incidents that can be directly linked to the above premises. The officers at Amesbury consider that this fact is directly attributable to the increased number of Door Staff. Further, the number on people in Amesbury on a Friday and Saturday night has been greatly reduced over the summer, a situation that we anticipate changing over the coming weeks.

In view of the effectiveness of the conditions imposed by the committee we would seek for the conditions to remain a part of any new license issued to Mr T Rigg for the above premises. In light of the expected increase in numbers of people utilising the night economy in Amesbury we would also support the issue of a further short term licence.

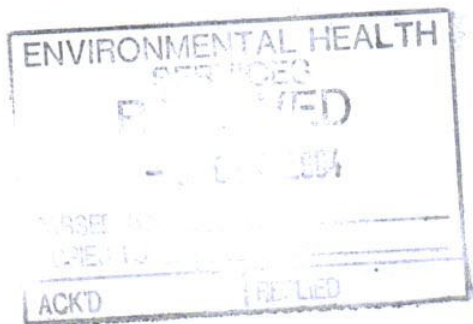
We also observe that, currently the transfer of patrons between premises after the hour of midnight does lead to increased incidents of Public Disorder and Anti Social Behaviour in the centre of Amesbury. It may be worthy of the committee to consider imposing a last time re-entry condition of 23.59hrs as part of a review process, to all of the late night premises in Amesbury. This action could enhance the existing conditions and help reduce incidents of Crime and Disorder/Anti Social Behaviour in Town Centre of Amesbury.

Thank you for your letter AJO/sn/PEF055 dated 28th September 2004 concerning the above premises Public Entertainment Licence.

Having accompanied the police on one of their evening/early morning patrols recently and witnessed first-hand some crowd problems when the pubs close and the punters move from one venue to another, I would support a case for "no admission or re-admission" to night-clubs with late licenses.

I realise that Riggsy's is the only premises in question on this particular occasion, but I would only support the "no admission or re-admission" condition provided it could be similarly applied to the other late-night licensed premises in the Town when their licenses come up for renewal as well.

As regards a "cut off" time, would suggest 23.59 (Wednesday to Saturday inclusive) but my colleagues may have other ideas.
