SUMMARY OF OBJECTIONS AND COMMENTS

	OBJECTION	RESPONSE
1	Residents object to a charge for parking permits without a guaranteed space.	As set out in paragraphs 11 and 12 of the report.
2	Residents object to “loss” of residents parking space to City Centre Pay and Display parking.	As set out in paragraphs 13 and 15 of the report.
3	Residents are concerned that the inclusion of permits for other City Centre residents will increase competition for spaces.	As set out in paragraphs 14 of the report.
4	Residents are concerned that the issuing of business permits in Zone E will increase competition for spaces.	As set out in paragraphs 15 of the report.
5	Residents support the introduction of Park and Ride as a means of reducing the need for on-street shopper parking in the City Centre.	As set out in paragraphs 16 of the report.
6	Residents want to increase the amount of on-street parking available.	As set out in paragraphs 17 of the report.
7	Residents see little value in reducing the duration of parking from 2 hours to ½ hour on part of Exeter Street.	As set out in paragraphs 18 of the report.
8	Allow resident permit holders to use Pay and Display spaces at no charge and no time limit.	Unfairly balanced against local business.
9	Create a single City Centre parking zone.	Maybe a future option to consider once the ratio of permits to spaces under the proposed scheme has settled down.
10	Need for concessions for disabled drivers.	The current and proposed scheme permits unrestricted parking of Orange/Blue badge holders.
11	Need for drop off area for Hussey’s Almshouses.	Already raised by Paul Sample and will be the subject of a report to the Salisbury Transportation Plan Joint Advisory Panel.
12	Charges should be spread across all Council tax payers.	Evidence from surrounding towns and cities suggests Salisbury is alone in being far more generous in this respect.
13	On-street parking encourages congestion and pollution.	The proposal significantly reduces the area available for shoppers to park.
14	Introduce charges from Private Non residential parking.	The local authorities will monitor the effectiveness of such policies elsewhere in the first instance.

15	Visitors will not be able to park close.	The proposal will make it easier for residents visitors by removing shoppers.
16	Convert short stay car parks to residential and business use.	Currently this would undermine customer base for local shops.
17	Objects to charges for parking on-street.	Principle has already been established.
18	Results of Questionnaire survey were interpreted to produce required result.	The questionnaire was clear and the analysis simple and factual.
19	Impact of home carers.	The District Council is currently developing a permit system for Social Services and Health Care professionals when on call.
20	Content with current mixed-use bays.	Majority of respondees voted for residents only in his zone.
21	Failure to consult properly and take note of responses.	Consultations were analysed and the majority of respondees views used to modify proposals.
22	Failing to deliver what was indicated and misleading the public.	The consultation letter clearly indicated the mixture of residents and pay and display bays.
