

**RELEVANT MINERAL POLICIES OF THE WILTSHIRE
STRUCTURE PLAN 2011 - ADOPTED 2001**

POLICY MSP4

SIGNIFICANT WORKABLE MINERAL DEPOSITS SHOULD BE SAFEGUARDED AGAINST OTHER FORMS OF DEVELOPMENT AND, WHENEVER PRACTICABLE, SHOULD BE EXTRACTED PRIOR TO ANY DEVELOPMENT WHICH COULD RESULT IN THEIR STERILISATION.

POLICY MSP5

THE MINERAL PLANNING AUTHORITY WILL SEEK TO:-

- MAINTAIN A LANDBANK FOR SAND AND GRAVEL IN ACCORDANCE WITH GOVERNMENT GUIDANCE. IN DOING SO, SEPARATE LANDBANKS WILL BE MAINTAINED FOR SHARP AND SOFT SAND AND GRAVEL; AND
- IDENTIFY PREFERRED AREAS, AREAS OF SEARCH AND SITE SELECTION CRITERIA FOR THE EXTRACTION OF SHARP AND SOFT SAND AND GRAVEL IN THE MINERALS LOCAL PLAN, BASED ON THE SUB-REGIONAL APPORTIONMENT AS AGREED BY THE REGIONAL WORKING PARTY, TO ENSURE THE MAINTENANCE OF THESE LANDBANKS

**RELEVANT POLICIES OF THE ADOPTED WILTSHIRE AND

POLICY 2

PLANNING PERMISSION WILL BE GRANTED FOR MINERALS DEVELOPMENT ONLY WHEN ALL ITS LIKELY ADVERSE IMPACTS WILL BE KEPT TO AN ACCEPTABLE MINIMUM.

POLICY 38

NOTWITHSTANDING THE REQUIREMENTS OF POLICY 36, EXTENSIONS TO EXISTING SOFT SAND AND SHARP SAND AND GRAVEL WORKINGS WILL BE PERMITTED PROVIDED THAT EITHER:-

1. THE DEVELOPMENT WILL MEET ACTUAL OR FORECAST SHORTFALL IN THE SOFT SAND OR SHARP SAND AND GRAVEL LANDBANK; OR

2. THE MINERAL WOULD BE STERILISED IF PLANNING PERMISSION WERE NOT GRANTED; AND

IN ALL CASES THE PROPOSALS COMPLY WITH ALL OTHER RELEVANT POLICIES OF THIS PLAN.

POLICY W3

PROVISION FOR AN ADEQUATE NETWORK OF WASTE MANAGEMENT FACILITIES SHOULD BE MADE HAVING REGARD TO:-

- MEETING THE WASTE MANAGEMENT NEEDS OF THE AREA
- THE PROXIMITY OF THE FACILITIES TO THE SOURCE OF THE WASTE
- MAKING A CONTRIBUTION, WHERE APPROPRIATE, TOWARDS ACHIEVING REGIONAL SELF SUFFICIENCY
- ACHIEVING THE BEST PRACTICABLE ENVIRONMENTAL OPTION

POLICY W4

PROPOSALS FOR WASTE MANAGEMENT FACILITIES SHOULD HAVE REGARD TO EFFECTS ON LOCAL AMENITIES, NEARBY LAND USES, LANDSCAPE, THE NATURAL AND HISTORIC ENVIRONMENT, TRAFFIC GENERATION, WATER RESOURCES, POLLUTION AND RESTORATION AND AFTERCARE OF THE SITE.

POLICY 19

EXTENSIONS TO EXISTING LANDFILL SITES

EXTENSIONS TO EXISTING LANDFILL SITES WILL ONLY BE PERMITTED WHERE THE APPLICATION DEMONSTRATES TO THE SATISFACTION OF THE WASTE PLANNING AUTHORITIES THAT THE PROPOSAL:-

- IS NECESSARY FOR OPERATIONAL OR RESTORATION PURPOSES
- PROVIDES FOR ON SITE RECOVERY OF WASTE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE BPEO (WHERE APPROPRIATE)

- MAKES PROVISION FOR THE MANAGEMENT AND CONTROL OF THE GENERATION OF ANY LEACHATE AND LANDFILL GAS INCLUDING, WHERE APPROPRIATE, THE RECOVERY OF ENERGY FROM LANDFILL GAS; AND
- COMPLIES WITH OTHER RELEVANT POLICIES OF THIS PLAN INCLUDING THOSE CONCERNING THE PROTECTION OF THE ENVIRONMENT, HUMAN HEALTH AND AMENITY
