(PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) ORDER 2003

The Council of the County of Wiltshire in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (2), 22(1) and 22(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") as amended and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:-

1. Save as provided in Articles 2 and 3 of this Order, no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform cause or permit any motor vehicle to proceed along the length of byways specified in the Schedule to this Order.
2. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall apply so as to prevent any person from causing or permitting any motor vehicle to proceed on the length of byways referred to in the Schedule to this Order if the vehicle is being used:
 - (i) in the service of the Local Authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties or in the services of the Police Authority, Fire Brigade, or Ambulance Service;
 - (ii) in connection with any building operation, or demolition in or adjacent to the byways, the removal of any obstruction to traffic in the byways, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the byways, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or adjacent to the byways of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 of the Telecommunications Act 1984;
3. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall apply so as to prevent any person from causing or permitting any motor vehicle to proceed on the length of byways referred to in the Schedule to this Order if the vehicle is being used in connection with the maintenance of land or for associated agricultural purposes.
4. This Order shall come into operation on the 2003 and may be cited as The County of Wiltshire (Smeathe's Ridge in the Parishes of Ogbourne St. Andrew and Ogbourne St. George) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 2003.

Statement of the County Council's Reasons
For Proposing To Make The Above-Mentioned Order

Section 1(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

- “(b) for preventing damage to the road or to any building on or near the road;
- (c) for facilitating the passage on the road or any other road of any class of traffic (including pedestrians);
- (e) for preserving the character of the road in a case where it is specially suitable for use by persons on horseback or on foot,
- (f) for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the road runs”

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Wiltshire County Council proposes to make the above-mentioned Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to prohibit the driving of motor vehicles on the following length of byways:

Byway

Description

Ogbourne St. Andrew Byway 15 at
Upper Herdswick Farm

From its junction with Byway 8 (at a point approximately 250 metres to the south-east of Barbury Castle Car Park) in a general south-easterly direction for approximately 4820 metres to the Parish boundary.

Ogbourne St. George, Byway 4

From the Parish boundary easterly for 340 metres to its junction with Ogbourne St. George 3.

Ogbourne St. George 3 (Byway section)

From its junction with Ogbourne St. George Byway 4 to Chiseldon Road C3, a distance of approximately 270 metres.

Deposit copies of the Order, plan and Statement of the County Council's Reasons for proposing to make the Order may be inspected at the offices of the Director of Environmental Services, County Hall, Trowbridge during normal office hours. For the convenience of local residents a further copy of the documents may be seen at the offices of Marlborough Town Council, Council Offices, 5 High Street, Marlborough between the hours of 9.00 am and 5.00 pm Monday to Thursday and 9.00 am and 4.30 pm on Fridays for the duration of the objection period.

Objections or other representations to the proposals together with the grounds on which they are made should be sent in writing to reach the undersigned by not later than 27 October 2003 quoting reference JM/TRO/RIDGE.
