Street Pastors will give drunk and emotional people the opportunity to talk it out, reducing fights and violence. SPs will help the vulnerable (especially women whose alcohol intake makes them vulnerable to sexual assault) to get home safely. They will signpost to local organisations who can help with the root cause of emotional distress, eg drug and alcohol abuse or domestic violence etc. They will pick up glass bottles which may be used as a weapon. As a neutral presence they will be trained to receive surrendered offensive weapons on behalf of the police. They will help visitors to find buses and taxis. Street Pastors will help build a safer a resilient city centre community, typically a drop of 25-30% in crime is reported by the police where street pastors operate and in some areas serious sexual assaults have dropped to zero (eg Southampton & Portsmouth) Safer environments benefit the whole community; reduced demand on police and paramedic resources, reduced fear of crime resulting in an increased potential for local businesses to prosper.

We already have in place some ongoing funding from local churches and individuals. We will develop this funding stream to provide for running costs in future years.
We have a grant from the Aldhelm Mission Fund of £4,000, we will apply for further funding from them.
We will develop supporter run fundraising events.
Street Pastors nationally is seeing a drop in crime of approx 25% in the vicinity and consequently local police forces have provided funding to local Street Pastor's initiatives. Once up and running we will apply for police funding
The Home Office is already funding the London initiative, it is hoped that they will extend this to local initiatives in the future

Salisbury Street Pastors has over 30 volunteers from 14 local churches involved. SPs is working in conjunction with Salisbury police (especially Sergeant Richard Goodman and Inspector David McMullin) National results show that Street Pastors reduce the demands on both police & paramedic resources. SPs is also working with Pub Watch. The main beneficiaries of the project will be the people on the Streets of Salisbury at night, with a knock effect for the local business community and the public at large. Street Pastors will keep a log of all activities and will monitor crime statistics and conduct ongoing surveys to determine the outcome of the project and help in its future development.
