At the WAC meeting on 29th May 2008 the Committee agreed to allocate discretionary funding to parishes with a population of less than 1000 (33 of 37 parishes) for a secondary compactor vehicle at the additional cost of £202 per parish. Therefore a balance of £6,666 must be put aside from the discretionary budget, until confirmation on the number of Parishes wishing to take advantage of the offer has been received. The deadline for Parishes to respond to the offer is Friday 11th July (Any remaining money from the £6,666 would be put back into the discretionary budget for tranches 2 and 3).

The Village Hall Grants Committee has awarded the Michael Herbert Hall a grant of £1,429 from the WAC discretionary budget 08/09.

After deducting the two amounts detailed above from the discretionary budget, the remaining funds available for 2008/09 total £31,255. If this amount was divided over the three tranches of 2008/09 there would be £10,418.33 per tranche available.
