208. Public Questions/Statement Time:

There were none.

209. Councillor Questions/Statement Time:

Councillor Fowler updated the Committee on the health of committee member Councillor John Cole-Morgan stating that he hoped that he would be attending the next Full Council meeting.

Councillor Fowler also informed members that he was attending an enforcement hearing of West Wiltshire District Council regarding signage on the A303. He stated that he would update members on the outcome of the meeting via the Area Coordinator. Councillor Jeans also noted that he had received a response from the Minister for Transport regarding signage on the A303 which stated that there had been no such directive from her department to remove signs advertising local businesses.

Councillor Spencer expressed concern that the Highways Agency had not consulted local residents and parish councils on period of closure of the A303 due to the impact that this closure would have on the western area of the District. The Committee resolved to write to the Highways Agency to request that consultation with the areas of the district most affected be carried out (appendix 1).









210. Minutes:

213. Conservation Area Appraisals – Broad Chalke, Dinton, Hindon and Tisbury:

This item was deferred for further consultation.

NB. Principal Conservation Officer comments: The conservation team had failed to consult the AONB Working Group on the conservation area appraisals that fall within the AONB in line with the protocol approved by Cabinet in March 2006. This was pointed out to the conservation officers by the Landscape and Planning Adviser from the AONB Office two days before the committee (i.e. on the Tuesday), and officers felt that they should withdraw the item from committee and carry out the consultation. The AONB Office has indicated that it will seek to comment as soon as practicable, after which the conservation officers will need to assess the response and amend the documents as necessary before bringing the item back to committee.

214. Enforcement Report – Freestanding directional sign on the south side of the A303, Charnage Down. Mere:

The Committee considered the previously circulated report of the Principal Planning Officer (Enforcement).

Resolved – that the council enters into a Section 106 Obligation with the landowner/advertiser in accordance with option 2 of the report, the effect would be that any future change to the sign currently displayed, ie its replacement with another sign or alterations to its size, location or method of display or use of colour and graphics, shall not be carried out unless it has first been agreed in writing by the council; and that concurrent with completion of the Section 106 Agreement, the discontinuance notice dated 14 July 2008 is withdrawn.

NB. Councillor Parker requested that his dissent be recorded.

215. Planning Application S/2008/1593 – Demolition of Existing Storage Building and Erection of Detached Dwelling and Double Garage at Land Adjacent to Drove Cottage The Drove Bishopstone Salisbury SP5 4BP For Brimble Lea and Partners:

Mr Bailey, a local resident, spoke in objection to the application. Mr Carpendale, the agent, spoke in support of the application.

The committee considered a presentation from the Planning Officer in conjunction with the previously circulated report of the Head of Development Services and further to a site visit held earlier in the day and information contained in the schedule of additional correspondence.

Resolved: that the above application be refused for the following reasons:

- (1) The proposed development, by reason of its siting and layout, would result in an introverted and backland pattern of development that would not reflect the prevailing character of this part of Bishopstone. Nor does it reach the high standards required within the Cranborne Chase and West Wiltshire Downs Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty because of its layout, width and height. The proposal would therefore have an adverse impact upon the character and appearance of the area, contrary to saved policies C4, C5 and H19 of the Adopted Salisbury District Local Plan and the advice in Planning Policy Statements 1 and 7.
- (2) The proposed development, by reason of its inclusion of land outside of the Housing Restraint Area boundary as residential curtilage, would conflict with saved policies C2, H23, C4 and C5 of the Adopted Salisbury District Local Plan, and the advice in Planning Policy Statement 7, the aim of which is to restrict new residential development to

designated areas, and to protect the natural beauty of the countryside and Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

(3) The proposed development, in that it does not make adequate provision for public recreational open space, would be contrary to policy R2 of the Adopted Salisbury District Local Plan.
