The Committee heard verbal representations from a representative of Punch Taverns and the landlord in support of the application.

Resolved – That having taken into consideration the representations made in writing and at the hearing, the Licensing Act with the guidance issued, and the Council's statement of licensing policy, the committee resolved to

Grant the application with the following restrictions:

• That the application for non-standard timings for all licensable activities on all bank holiday Mondays and Boxing Day be refused where the next day will be a working day as this falls outside the









Council's statement of licensing policy.

- That the application for all licensable activities for New Years Eve be granted for the hours enshrined in grandfather rights.
- That the one outside event, as applied for, be granted, but that the licensee must apply for a temporary event notice for any other occasional event.

And subject to the following condition:

All windows and doors must be closed from 2330 on all days when regulated entertainment is being provided (except for the one occasional outside event as listed above).

In coming to this decision the committee took into account the size, style and character of the premises. The committee considered that there was no evidence or likelihood of noise and disturbance from the premises other than from the provision of music and this could be overcome by ensuring that all doors and windows remain closed after 2330.

All parties were informed that they have the right to appeal to the magistrate's court should they be dissatisfied with the decision. There is a right to a review of a premises license once the license comes into effect.
