#### 3. Performance and Other Local Issues:

#### **Drugs Operation**

Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> April NPT working in partnership with DCT, CID and the intelligence department conducted an operation in Chippenham targeting known individuals and address linked to drugs supply. Plain clothes Officers and uniformed officers were actively patrolling areas and stop searching anyone linked to drug supply. Although no arrests were made the operation was seen as a success due to causing major disruption to the drug supply and gaining valuable intelligence. Future operations are planned and NPT will continue to proactively patrol and gather intelligence

#### School Visit - Internet Safety Day

Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> March NPT visited Ivy Lane Primary School to give a talk on Internet safety to years 5 and year 6 age groups. This was following up on a Nationwide event back in February where Neighbourhood Policing teams all over Wiltshire visited Primary Schools and gave talks on how to stay safe using the internet and social media sites. The event was a success and feed back from the schools in



Chippenham was positive and in particular the school children who enjoyed meeting their local Police.

#### **Speed Checks**

NPT have regularly been conducting high visibility speed checks in and around Chippenham Town and Chippenham rural. Speeds checks have recently been done in Ford, Kington Langley and Langley Burrell. On all 3 occasions no speeding vehicles have been found/caught. NPT will continue to conduct speed checks and anyone found speeding will be dealt with robustly.

## **Child Exploitation day**

On the 18<sup>th</sup> March NPT visited local business such as B&B's, leisure centre's, local shops and taxi firms to speak to and provide information on Child Exploitation and the signs to watch out for. # The National Child Sexual Exploitation Awareness Day



On the 18th March we Champion the National Child Exploitation Awareness Day. It aims to highlight the issues surrounding CSE; encouraging everyone to **think**, **spot and speak out against abuse** and adopt a zero tolerance to adults developing inappropriate relationships with children.

NWG are committed to the fight against CSE and supporting victims and their families who are subjected to child sexual exploitation. But they cannot succeed without the support of people like you.

Together, we can work to inform, educate and prevent this form of child sexual abuse within the UK.

We believe that if we can make more people aware, not only through our National CSE Awareness Day, but all year round through our campaign, that we can improve the chances of young people being heard.

#### Police bicycles.

Chippenham NPT have been recently been given funding to purchase 2 new Police bicycles to increase our visibility and allow his to cover more distance when on patrol.

#### **Shoplifting Boots.**

Since March the 16<sup>th</sup> there have been over 11 shoplifting offences from Boots in Chippenham. Boots security, working in partnership with NPT and Security teams in Emery Gate and Borough Parade, have made 7 arrests in relation to shoplifting offences. Of the 7 arrests 3 were dealt with via Community Resolution and the remaining were all charged waiting court dates. NPT and Security teams in Chippenham continue to work together and gather intelligence identify potential shoplifters and our prolific offenders.
