We are committed to making a real difference to the lives of people in Dorset and Wiltshire. Our aim is to reduce the level of risk and harm to our communities from fire, targeting those most at risk. We do this primarily through our Safe and Well visits.

A Safe and Well visit is **FREE** and normally lasts about one hour covering topics such as:

- Using electricity safely
- Cooking safely
- Making an escape plan
- What to do if there is a fire
- Keeping children safe
- Good practice night time routine and other points relevant to you
- Identifying and discussing any further support the occupier may need

Are you or anyone you know:-

- Need a smoke detector?
- Have a long-term health condition?
- Suffer from poor hearing or sight loss?
- Would you struggle to escape in the event of a fire?

On Call Recruitment

Have you always wondered if you could join the fire service, but haven't had the opportunity to find out more? Have you found yourself seeking your next challenge, keen to give back to the local community or wanting to learn new skills including leadership and teamwork? Then becoming an on-call firefighter is for you.

As a paid position, on-call firefighters commit anywhere between 40 to 120 hours per week, during which time they must be able to respond to the station immediately.

Many have 'normal' jobs during the day, then upon their return home make themselves available overnight or during the weekends. Some of our crew respond from their workplaces during the day, and we are very grateful to their employers for releasing them to perform their vital duties.

Anyone over 18 years old can apply (although you can also apply once you are 17½) you must be able to respond and attend the fire station within 5-8 minutes, you have a good standard of physical fitness (i.e. you are generally active), and you must have the right to work in the UK.

In order for the session to be ongoing requires a volunteer group leader. One has been found but she needs to go on a course which costs £80, so it was agreed that the Area Board would cover the cost of this course and up to £20 in travel expenses.

Project Description:

The Independent Living Centre ILC provides impartial advice to older people and their families living in Wiltshire through an on-site Occupational Therapist OT and a benefits advice service. However less than 13 of our annual income comes from local authority commissioned contracts. In 2018-19 we supported 29 people in the Westbury area with benefits advice that enabled them to access approximately 55k of benefits per annum. We would therefore like to request a grant of 3.0k from Westbury Area Board to enable us to enable more people and their families to access the benefits to which they are entitled.

Input from Community Engagement Manager:

This was approved between area board meetings due to a misunderstanding which meant that the ILC representative was not present in the room when this application was heard at the last area board meeting and the decision was taken to defer it. Any questions that the board had have been answered via email and the board members are now satisfied enough to award the grant.
