<p>This application meets youth activities grant criteria 2019/20</p> <p>Project Summary: The Bridge Pastoral Support Project is based in several local secondary schools. We offer 1 to 1 support for young people who may be struggling with short-term crises or more generally with issues around mental health and self-esteem. We have been invited to serve students at Stonehenge School. The Assistant Head says We are working with hugely reduced budgets in a society where resilience is at an all-time low and we need to partner with organisations such as The Bridge to enable us to make strides forward in the areas of mental health and wellbeing for our young people locally.</p>		
<p>Applicant: Rotary Social Innovation Amesbury Project Title: Work Experience introduction to business for 14 to 17 year old students</p>	<p>Amount Requested from Area Board: £430.00</p>	
<p>This application meets youth activities grant criteria 2019/20</p> <p>Project Summary: To provide a positive link between the local youth requiring work experience during their G.C.S.Es and local business who are in a position to be able to provide this service with the potential of permanent employment. Currently little if any opportunities like this exist and we have identified this gap. The intention of the Rotary is to bridge that gap by providing a series of work experience expos to increase awareness within the local community area</p>		

Applicant: Durrington Youth Services Project Title: Durrington Youth Services	Amount Requested from Area Board: £6513.50		
This application meets grant criteria 2014/15. Project Summary: Durrington Youth Services provide 3 youth sessions per week for 48 weeks of the year to children and young people in the age range of 7 - 19. We provide a safe and welcoming environment for children and young people to engage in a range of activities projects and opportunities where they can develop new skills and build confidence. We build positive relationships with children and young people to provide information advice guidance and support. All sessions are designed based on children and young peoples needs and interests. We are advocates for the children and young people who attend managing this service for them.			
There is currently £18,231.30 remaining in the Amesbury Youth Activities budget. If these projects are funded, the amount remaining will be £6,487.80 .
