Bail Checks, Melksham – 3 Youths on Bail for Offences of Arson/Criminal Damage/ Burglary – Stringent Bail Checks


Semington Bus Gate, Melksham – Patrols Following Community Complaints / Reports of Non-Compliance with the Bus Gate

Melksham Statistics


CRIME STATS JAN/FEB 2023 v JAN/FEB 24



- *Violence is down from 2023 improving SAFER SPACES in Melksham.
- *Criminal Damage is being kept down despite a surge in juvenile crime
- *Vehicle crime has spiked in February as a result of one incident with multiple vehicles targeted in Bowerhill. There is potential this is linked to a incident in Swindon.
- *Drug offending remains low
- *Theft offending has declined in Feb 2024.
- *Burglary is showing as an increase, again down to three regular youth offenders who are being repeatedly put before the courts.

Melksham Traffic... What are we doing?

- Speed Enforcement operated two sessions at Shaw Hill at A365 Folly Lane and caught 41 vehicles speeding. The roads in this area have a clearly displayed speed limit of 30 mph. The fastest vehicle was captured travelling at 49 mph.
- Speed Enforcement operated at B3353, Whitely School, Whitely and caught 5 vehicles speeding. The roads in this area have a clearly displayed speed limit of 30mph. The fastest vehicle was captured travelling at 40mph. On the day in question, it was overcast with sunny periods.
- Speed Enforcement operated at Shaw and Whitley A365 Folly Lane and caught 18 vehicles speeding. The
 roads in this area have a clearly displayed speed limit of 30mph. The fastest vehicle was captured travelling at
 48mph.
- Speed Enforcement operated at 2 sites in Shaw and Whitley and caught 14 vehicles speeding. The roads in this area have a clearly displayed speed limit of 30mph. The fastest vehicle was captured travelling at 47mph.
- Speed Enforcement operated at Melksham Woodrow Road, Melksham and caught 5 vehicles speeding.
 The roads in this area have a clearly displayed speed limit of 30mph. The fastest vehicle was captured travelling at 39mph.





Direction in the next three months alongside business as usual:

In the coming three months the focus for the team is to continue building on our community foundations.

*We will educate and deter the younger generations from crime with school visits; youth club visits; working with Stronger Families and offering mentor interaction with our most vulnerable to crime and exploitation.

*We will increase the feeling of safety in our public spaces with plain clothes operations in areas of drug dealing and use. For those in the community who want a scaffold to support them out and about we will be offering 'Safer Spaces accompanied patrols' where members of the public can walk with us (in or out of uniform) to discuss what makes them feel at risk. We will then evaluate what we can do to tackle the hurdles causing our community to feel unsafe.

*We will work with our Neighbourhood Harm Reduction Unit to work with our volunteer sector- weapon sweeps in parks; Community Speedwatch support and increase community visibility.


