

Flooding 2023/24

- Over 400 reported properties flooded
- 100+ communities affected by flooding
- Wettest since 1871, when records began
- 21 named storms Agnes, Babet, Ciaran, Debi, Elin, Fergus, Gerrit, Henk, Isha, Jocelyn, Kathleen, Lilian, Minnie, Nicholas, Olga, Piet, Regina, Stuart, Tamiko, Vincent and Walid
- We are still gathering information and data, and we are still new reports of property flooding

Marlborough

- Storm Babet flooded thousands of homes in October 2023.
- Ground has been saturated following a series of winter storms. Storm Gerrit hit in late December 2023 followed by Storm Henk
- More than 40 mm of rain in 24 hours
- Result would be c.600 million litres of rainfall deposited in this already saturated catchment.




Town & Parish Councils

- Make a Flood Plan.....
- Report blocked gullies, and internal property flooding via the MyWilts App.
- Use the discretionary gully tanker sewers@wiltshire.gov.uk
- Use the parish steward to assist with drainage assets.
- Use the ditch letters to those owners whose ditches if not maintained will cause internal property flooding. As per the guidance.
- Encourage residents to take steps to protect their property from flooding before it floods.
- Make a flood plan
- If we don't know about it we can't do anything about it!



MyWilts app to report issues



Resistance Measures

- Resistance means stopping the water from coming in, however you may have to let the water in if it reaches a certain height.
- Flood Door
- Non return valves
- Waterproof coating
- Flood Gates



Resilience Measures

- Accepting the water is going to come in to preparing the property to enable you to get back into it quicker
- Tiled flooring
- Raising boilers up high
- Stainless steel kitchen or wood
- Plasterboard fixed horizontally
- Wooden doors
- Raising electrical sockets



TEAM FOCUS, ACTION & PRIORITIES:

FOCUS- The team has focused on burglaries within the area. They have provided crime prevention advice online and in our drop-in surgeries. In upcoming surgeries, we will be offering DNA Selecta kits secured through force funding. We have proactively patrolled our areas and are working with a number of teams to pull together evidence and intelligence on inquisitive crime on our area.



ACTION- We have completed three Operations- Op Scorpion, Safer Business Awareness Week and Rural Crime Awareness Week.

For Op Scorpion we targeted criminal transport links with a variety of traffic stops; speed gun duties and patrolling our transport links. We also visited addresses linked to vulnerable people who are at risk of being cuckooed.



For Safer Businesses we have visited our local businesses and invited them to a meeting for each town in our NPT area. This will launch discussions around their needs and expectations and how we can best meet them. We are also liaising with our Neighbourhood Harm Reduction Team to look at ways in which shops can deter, rather than encourage shoplifters with clearer product displays; clear CCTV observation points and moving high value goods to more secure locations.

For Rural Crime Week, we worked alongside the Rural Crime Team and Wiltshire Council to tackle waste disposal offences; checking the legality of our Scrap Metal sites and engaged with our farms to ensure they feel heard and protected.







PRIORITIES-

Safer Night Time Economy- we will be working alongside other Neighbourhood Policing Teams to promote safety whilst enjoying nights out in our town. The team will be checking licensing conditions in our pubs; offering Ask Angela education and drink spiking advice.

Retail Crime- We will continue working with our local businesses to increase their feeling of safety whilst working within our town. We will continue to carry out both visibility and plain clothes patrols to enforce, reassure and detect.

Don't forget! We hold a drop in surgery every first Tuesday of the month in The Hub 10am-11am



- The team have carried out a successful week of rural village engagement, in total ten surrounding villages were visited.
- We have secured dates in place until December for allocated, routine speed gun patrols.
- We have initiated regular drop in visits to youth centres on our patch. If you have any individual ones in the villages please do let us know so that we can attend.
- Two juveniles are being dealt with for criminal damage at Bradford on Avon Library- we engaged with the library and youth deterrence workers for a holistic approach. One youth received an out of court disposal, the other has opted for interview and investigation.
- We are working with the Rural Crime Team to tackle issues the community feel strongly about with the development of housing on the old golf course site to ensure no offences are committed.
- Two people have been charged with theft of a delivery van in Bradford on Avon.
- We now have a permanent fixing for our drop in surgery- on the 1st Tuesday of every month, come down to The Hub to have a chat with the team, 10am-11am

Statistics show that there has been a rise in some offences within the area, which tie in with the national picture.

We have also experienced the least amount of social media interaction and engagement in this area compared to Trowbridge and Melksham. As such our drive is to booster our contact and communication with the public and drive attendance at our drop in surgeries which provide crime prevention advice.

This drive will include:

*Burglary advice surgeries promoting the DNA selecta kits


*Days of action with plain clothes patrols to target theft and ASB working alongside The Canal Trust, BTP and A&S police
