Statutory Context

ICBs have a statutory responsibility for assessing individuals for eligibility for NHS Continuing Healthcare funding. The National Framework for NHS Continuing Healthcare and NHS Funded Nursing Care (July 2022) sets out the principles and processes to be followed by ICBs.

Aims and Benefits of CHC Funding

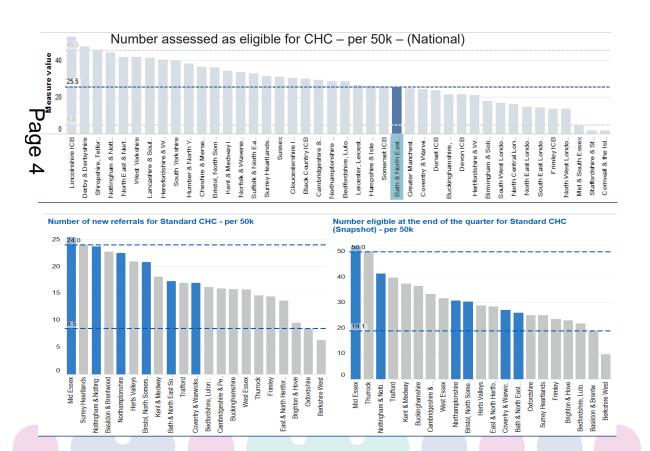
CHC funding is a package of care provided to individuals who have been assessed as having a primary health need. It is fully funded by the NHS and aims to:

- Support individuals with significant and ongoing healthcare needs.
- Enable care to be delivered in the most appropriate setting, whether at home or in a care facility.





The proportion of assessments resulting in CHC eligibility in Wiltshire compared to national conversion rates and nearest neighbour conversion rates.



- The top diagram demonstrates BSW is within the confidence levels of individuals assessed as eligible for CHC per 50k nationally.
- The diagrams below show comparative positions with BSWs nearest neighbours based on demographics which again demonstrates BSW ICB being within the confidence levels of both receipt of new referrals for CHC per 50k and the number eligible for CHC per 50k.

- Regional data demonstrates that BSW ICB has the joint highest Referral conversion to eligibility rate in the South-West and the second highest Assessment conversion to eligibility rate in the South-West.
- Regional data also demonstrates that BSW ICB has exceeded the 80% target of assessments being completed within 28 days of notification.

- The Continuing Healthcare Dashboard captures the granular data for our localities.
- Wiltshire has approximately the same population as Swindon and BaNES combined.
- Data reflects the previous slides reporting of a 22% conversion rate to eligibility for Wiltshire residents.
- Data also reflects the reported increase in positive checklists which has been a sustained increase over the past year in all three localities.
