REVIEW OF RESIDENTS' PARKING ZONE D, SALISBURY

Purpose of Report

To:

- (i) Consider comments on the proposed amendment of the layout of waiting restrictions in Residents' Parking Zone D (RPZD), Salisbury.
- (ii) Recommend the making of the Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) as advertised.

Consultation

Consultation has been undertaken with:

- Councillor Matthew Dean, one of the elected Salisbury City Council Members for the Sarum St. Paul's ward.

- Members of the public through the statutory TRO consultation process.
- Emergency services through the statutory TRO consultation process.

Options Considered

To:

- (i) Implement the proposals as advertised.
- (ii) Implement the proposals with minor amendments.

(iii) Abandon the proposals.

Reason for Decision

It is felt that the Council's proposals offer a balanced approach between meeting the wishes of local residents in providing additional parking spaces within RPZD whilst ensuring that the Council continues to meet its statutory duty.
