THE COUNTY OF WILTSHIRE (VARIOUS ROADS, CHIPPENHAM) 20-MPH SPEED LIMIT ORDER 2023

Purpose of Report

To consider the comments received following the formal advertisement of a proposed 20-mph speed limit in Chippenham, to include the following roads and to recommend an appropriate way forward.

Ashe Close Ashfield Road Birch Grove Cedar Grove Elmwood

Greenway Court Greenway Lane Hamlet Court Hill Rise Maple Way Murrayfields Oaklands

Pew Hill (southern spur)

The Oaks Willow Grove Ashe Crescent Barrow Green Broomfield Deansway

Consultation

Consultation has been undertaken with:

- The elected Wiltshire Council Members through the statutory TRO consultation process
- The elected Chippenham Town Council Members for all Wards through the statutory TRO consultation process
- Emergency services through the statutory TRO consultation process
- Members of the public through the statutory TRO consultation process

The proposed changes were subject to formal consultation ending on 22 May 2023. The advertisement plan can be seen in **Appendix 1**. During the consultation period a total of eight items of correspondence were received in response to the Council's proposals. Of the items received, six expressed support or partial support for the Council's proposals, two requested additional measures and two objected or partially objected to the Council's proposals. A list of respondents can be found in **Appendix 2**.

Options Considered

To:

- (i) Implement the proposals as advertised.
- (ii) Implement the proposals as advertised with amendments.
- (iii) Abandon the proposals.

Reason for Decision

The proposal is intended to improve road conditions by reducing the speed limit to 20-mph on these residential roads and is in line with national guidance. Collectively, these changes should provide a positive impact on road safety.

The proposals will also be in accordance with the following commitments set out by Wiltshire Council's Business Plan 2022-2032:

- Empowered People 'We are safe', 'We Stay Active'
- Resilient Society 'We ensure decisions are evidence based'
- Thriving Communities 'We have vibrant, well connected communities'
- Sustainable Environment 'We are on the path to carbon neutral'
