## 1. Purpose of Report

1.1 To determine an application for a Premises Licence in respect of Harnham Local, 1 Harnham Road, Salisbury, SP2 8JG made by Mrs Fatma Kaya-Cifci

## 2. Background Information

- 2.1 An application for a Premises Licence in respect of Harnham Local, 1 Harnham Road, Salisbury, SP2 8JG has been made by Mrs Fatma Kaya-Cifci The Knap, 156 Wilton Road, Salisbury, SP2 7LA for which eleven relevant representations have been received, ten objecting to the application and one in support.
- 2.2 Wiltshire Council (as the Licensing Authority) must hold a hearing to consider the application having regard to the representations. In accordance with Section 18 (3) of The Licensing Act 2003 the Licensing Sub Committee is required to take such of the steps listed in 2.4 below as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. In considering the application and the relevant representations, the Sub Committee must also have regard to relevant Government guidance and the Council's Licensing Policy

## 2.3 The licensing objectives are:

- i) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder;
- ii) Public Safety;
- iii) The Prevention of Public Nuisance: and
- iv) The Protection of Children from Harm.

#### 2.4 Such steps are:

- To grant the licence subject to such conditions as are consistent with those included in the operating schedule submitted with the application, modified to such extent as the Sub Committee considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, together with any mandatory conditions required by the Licensing Act.
- ii) To exclude from the scope of the application any licensable activity.
- iii) To refuse to specify a person as the designated premises supervisor.
- iv) To reject the application.

- 2.5 On 25<sup>th</sup> April 2016 an application for a new Premises Licence was received and accepted as a valid application.
- 2.6 The application as applied for is as follows:

## 3. Consultation and Representations

- 3.1 The application process requires the application to be advertised, by the Applicant, in a local news publication within 10 working days, starting on the day after the authority receives it and for a public notice (on pale blue paper) to be posted on the premises. In addition the Licensing Authority advertises the application on its website, for a period of 28 consecutive days, starting the day after the authority receives the application.
- 3.2 No public notice was displayed at the premises. This resulted in the consultation period being extended until 6<sup>th</sup> June, agreed with the applicants Agent.
- 3.3 During the consultation period eleven relevant representations have been received one from the local councillor and 10 from members of the Public. 9 were against the application and one was in support of it.

- 3.6 The relevant representations against and for are attached as **Appendix 3a** and appendix 3b
- 3.7 **Appendix 4** shows a detailed plan of the area.
- 3.8 In relation to shops, stores and supermarkets, the Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 states:

'Shops, stores and supermarkets should normally be free to provide sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises at any times when the retail outlet is open for shopping unless there are good reasons, based on the licensing objectives, for restricting those hours.'

#### 4. Legal Implications

4.1 This hearing is governed by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations. These provide that hearings should be held in public unless the Licensing Authority considers that the public interest in excluding the public outweighs the public interest in the hearing taking place in public.

- 4.2 The Applicant, and all persons who have made representations have been informed of the date, time and location of the hearing and their right to attend and be represented.
- 4.3 At the hearing all those who have made representations are entitled to address the Sub Committee and to ask questions of another party, with the consent of the Sub Committee.

#### 5. Officer Recommendations

5.1 Officers are not permitted to make a recommendation – the decision is to be reached by the members of the Licensing Sub Committee.

### 6. Right of Appeal

- 6.1 It should be noted that the Applicant and those persons who have made representations may appeal the decision made by the Licensing Sub Committee to the Magistrates Court. The appeal must be lodged with the Magistrates Court within 21 days of the notification of the decision.
- 6.2 In the event of an appeal being lodged, the decision made by the Licensing Sub Committee remains valid until any appeal is heard and any decision made by the Magistrates Court.
- 6.3 A Responsible Authority or any person may apply to the Licensing Authority for a Review of a Premises Licence. Whether or not a Review Hearing takes place is in the discretion of the Licensing Authority, but, if requested by a person other than a Responsible Authority it will not normally be granted within the first 12 months except for the most compelling circumstances.

#### a) General

These premises are a new acquisition which are being completely refurbished to be operated as a convenience store. The applicant wishes to enhance her business with the daily retail sale of alcohol, for consumption Off the premises.

## b) The Prevention of Crime & Disorder

A CCTV system will be maintained at the premises in accordance with the recommendations of the Wiltshire Police and images made available on request by the Police or other Authorised Officer.

The sale of intoxicating liquor will not be made to persons where there are grounds to believe that the sale will result in crime or disorder.

#### c) Public Safety

We will endeavour to insure that the premises are safe for both staff and the general public, a fire risk assessment will be undertaken.

#### d) The prevention of public nulsance

We contribute to alleviate public nuisance on/and in the vicinity of the premises during the times when the premises are open to members of the public.

All deliveries and the collection of refuge will take place during day hours as at present between 0900 hours and 1700 hours.

#### e)The protection of children from harm

All staff will be trained in the sale of age restricted products under the SWERCOTS guidance issued by trading standards( or under any new guidance that will supersedes it).

Training records for all staff will be maintained at the premises for a period of not less that twelve months, these records will be made available for inspection by and authorised officer on request. Refresher training will be given to all staff on a 6 monthly basis, or when there is a change in legislation.

Only PASS approved ID will be acceptable plus passport or photo driving licence.


A refusals register will be maintained at the premises, records of this will be kept for no less that twelve month and made available for inspection by an authorised officer request. The register will be signed off by the DPS/ Duty Manager at least once a week to ensure that all members of staff are using it.


The premises will adopt a Challenge 25 Policy, appropriate signage to this effect will be prominently displayed at the premises.



I wish to register an objection to this application on the following grounds.

1. Crime, disorder and public nuisance

St Nicholas Road suffers from persistent low-level anti-social behaviour exacerbated by alcohol as evidenced by the beer cans discarded in the road and tossed into gardens and the river. The nuisance typically comprises minor vandalism, shouting, car engines revved excessively and occasional trespass. Two properties owned by the Hospital in the road have been targeted, together with the Hospital itself. We have installed CCTV covering the road, the system regularly used by the police. The present level of disorder, though annoying, is mostly tolerated by fair-minded residents in a suburban setting, but there must be a concern that a further ready source of alcohol in the vicinity – a pub and hotel with several bars are within 100m of the premises in question – such as the grant of this licence would allow would lead to further aggravation.

2. Public safety

The premises in question stand on the corner of an awkward junction controlled by lights, accessed by a single-lane carriageway in one direction and narrow residential roads in two others. Two of these roads are a bus-route. There is extensive controlled on-street parking for residents and double-yellow lining. Patrons of the proposed off-licence arriving by car will almost inevitably have to park illegally and dangerously.

#### 3. Protection of children from harm

To an extent this must be a subjective assessment, but it should be noted that the premises stand on a well-frequented school-route for both primary and secondary pupils.

I would like to object on the following points:

### 1. Noise

The area is a quiet residential area, one of the reasons for living in this area is the proximity to city centre without the noise pollution living in the city centre would offer. This licence would attract vehicles and pedestrians to the shop until 11pm every evening creating unwelcome levels of noise in the area.

### 2. Odour

Following advice from Mr R Bahadoor, I am resubmitting my comments on the above application. I am following the headings of the representation form rather than completing the form.

At this stage, I have not been able to view the application. I am copying this email to Mr Ian Garrod with the request that he forward it. I may then submit supplementary comments. (It does not appear possible to view the application on line?)

I am objecting to the application as an individual.

My objections relate to two licensing objectives:

- 1. The prevention of public nuisance
- 2. The prevention of crime and disorder.

I have just been made aware of an application for a licence to sell alcohol at the above premises from 7 am - 11 pm. This is a quiet, residential neighbourhood, including sheltered housing for the elderly.

Residents on the route from the city centre to Harnham already suffer from incidents of vandalism - including apparently drink-inspired vandalism - especially on Friday and Saturday nights. The availability of alcohol up to 11pm will provide an opportunity for further alcohol intake late at night with the potential to increase noise levels as well as incidents of antisocial behaviour. By definition, the alcohol will not be consumed on the shop's premises. If the shop wishes to operate until 11 pm, I have no objection, but I believe any sale of alcohol from the evening onwards would cause public nuisance, and possible crime and disorder.

Clearly, the premises themselves have no linked records of poor behaviour because they are currently run as an antique shop. I would urge you however, to take into account evidence of antisocial behaviour in the neighbourhood, including police records, as well as the fact that there are already facilities to purchase alcohol at The Greyfisher and the Rose and Crown. This month, for instance, I have reported damage to my car (crime ref 54160040271) perpetrated by drunks walking back to Harnham from the city. On the same night, a neighbour's window was broken.

The above reference refers to a licensing application for 1 Harnham Rd Salisbury.

I live at 14 Harnham Rd.

Whilst I think I support the creation of what could be a very useful convenience for the area (as long as the outlet did provide a range of products and not just alcohol), the application for a licence to sell alcohol that extends from 7am to 11pm is excessive. If the intended retailing is to be exclusively alcohol i.e. an Off Licence rather than a convenience store selling a variety of products then my objection would be 100% against there is no requirement for that type of outlet and it would without doubt cause disturbance. This is a quiet residential spot with limited parking and many of the residents are elderly. The close proximity of the Greyfisher Public House must also be considered - the customers of this establishment potentially being the customers of the proposed Off Licence late at night.

One has to question the state of those requiring alcohol at any time after say 9pm and the reality is that it will more than likely be people who have already consumed alcohol. The result could be, and probably will be, excessive noise and disturbance late at night.

My other concern is regarding the nature of any intended change to the appearance of the shop which at the moment is in keeping with the area which is within a designated conservation area. We would hope the various planning departments will be vigilant in ensuring that any proposed change to the external appearance of the building will be in keeping with the style of the area - Harnham Rd has many listed buildings and the various agencies are always at pains to ensure that any proposed changes are appropriate. The type of signage for many convenience stores is typically "loud" - the "Best Local" and "Charlie's" I think it is called, in the centre of Salisbury for instance are examples. I realise this would have to be the subject of a different application but I thought I would make the point.

On balance I think this is not a good idea and will potentially cause lots of problems for residents and law enforcement agencies.

I live at 5 Ayleswade Road SP2 8DW which is directly opposite the shop site at no. 1 Harnham Road. I wish to object to proposal ref. no. WK/2016201609669.

This is a quiet residential area (also a conservation area) with many elderly residents. A shop selling alcohol from 7am until 11pm would simply not be appropriate. It would attract people to purchase alcohol (particularly when they come out of the Grey Fisher pub) and then stay around the bridge area to drink it late at night. There would be unacceptable noise both from people and cars, and cars would not find anywhere to park as the two roads are already jam packed with residents' vehicles from about 7pm. This could lead to double parking which is extremely dangerous at the three-way junction by the bridge.

I have no objection to the opening of a corner shop on the site, provided it closes at a reasonable hour (say 7pm) and does not advertise itself as an off-licence. There was a shop/post office on the site when I arrived here in 2000 and that was very useful for the community. However, I understand the lady applying for the licence already runs a 'Bargain Booze' shop on the Wilton Road, which attracts noisy customers late at night. We do NOT want a similar problem here in Harnham.

I write in support of this application. The applicant, Fatima Kaya- Cifci, is not known to me. However, I believe the re-opening of a convenience store at 1 Harnham Road, with an off-license, would bring substantial community benefits to the area, especially for the large number of elderly people who live within a few minutes walk of the shop.

Number 1 Harnham Road was built as a grocery store in about 1906 (" Hands Groceries and Provisions"). It was thriving when I used to pass it as a child in the 1950s and it remained so until about ten years ago, when the owner decided to end the tenancy of Mr and Mrs Heather and applied for planning permission for change of use. He was unsuccessful. It became a furniture and household goods emporium.

The corner shop had been an important focus of community life. A modest range of basic groceries was supplemented by a Post Office, newspapers, National Lottery tickets and wines and spirits. It was a real blow when the tenants were forced to close the business. It was a thriving commercial proposition. I live about 100 metres west of 1 Harnham Road. I believe it would be of great benefit to the whole community if this property could once again become an asset benefitting the whole community - especially the elderly.

I am aware of the Council's Licensing Objectives.

I know of no evidence that the granting of an off-licence would have any impact on the prevention of crime and disorder. The premises caused no crime and disorder that at I am aware of in the last 100 years or so.

I have lived here for 19 years. I was a regular user of the shop and I never heard any complaints of public nuisance connected with the shop. I cannot recall any complaints about parking problems. Most customers were local and came on foot.

I cannot imagine any circumstances in which public safety would be an issue. There was never, as far as I know, any complaint about the availability of alcohol at the shop. There are two pubs licensed by Wiltshire Council within about one hundred metres of 1 Harnham Road and only very rarely do their customers over-indulge to the extent of nuisance and never threatening public safety.

I cannot see any harm that would come to local children if this license were to be granted. I do recall that from time to time kids returning from school in the afternoons would attempt to steal sweets. The admonitions of Mr Heather would have done them nothing but good. Alcohol is rarely purchased before ten in the morning nor before four in the afternoon - outside school hours.

When the shop was operating as a convenience store, I can recall no occasion when there were traffic incidents caused by shop customers.

I hope that the Licensing Committee will look favourably on this application that is likely to enhance community cohesion in Harnham.
