# PROCEDURAL RULES FOR THE HEARING OF LICENSING ACT 2003 APPLICATIONS

# 1 Purpose

- 1.1 These rules have been prepared to facilitate proper consideration of licence applications, made under the Licensing Act 2003, by the Licensing Committee and its Sub Committees.
- 1.2 The rules set out a framework for how applications are to be heard and explain the role of the participants at the Hearing.

# 2 Definitions

- 2.1 The following definitions describe the participants at and the subject matter of a Hearing:
  - "Applicant" means the person who has submitted an Application for consideration by the Committee.
  - "Applicant's Premises" means premises subject to the Application.
  - "Applicant's Representative" means a person attending a Hearing to assist or represent an Applicant including a lawyer.
  - "Application" means an application for the Grant/Variation/Transfer/Review and any other decision to be made by the Committee/Sub-Committee in respect of a Licence.
  - "Chairperson" means the Member who is the Chairperson of the Committee for the particular Hearing.
  - "Committee" means the Council's Licensing Committee and includes any Sub Committee of the Licensing Committee.
  - "Committee Lawyer" means the Council's Lawyer (including an external Lawyer instructed by the Council's Legal & Democratic Services Manager) who is present at a Hearing to advise the Chairperson and the Members.
  - "Committee Manager" means the Council's Officer who is present at a Hearing to take minutes.
  - "Committee Report" means the Licensing Officer's written report to the Committee concerning an Application, a copy of which has been previously made available to the Applicant or their Representative, a Responsible

Authority or their Representative or any person who has made a Relevant Representation or their Representative.

- "Hearing" means a meeting of the Committee at which an Application is considered.
- "Licence" means a Licence which the Committee has the power or duty inter alia to grant, transfer, suspend or revoke.
- "Licensing Officer" means the Council's Licensing Officer(s) who is/are present at a Hearing to present reports in respect of an Application and to give technical advice in respect of an Application to the Committee when requested.
- "Licensing Authority" the Council in whose geographical area the subject matter of the Application relates to, and includes the Council's Licensing Committee, any Sub Committee of the Licensing Committee and a Licensing Officer.
- "**Member**" means a Member who is a Member of the Committee that is considering an Application.
- "Person making a Relevant Representation" means a person who is present at a Hearing to make representations in respect of an Application and includes any person who is present to assist or make representations on behalf of that person including a Lawyer.
- "Responsible Authority" means a person who is present at a Hearing to make representations in respect of an Application in their capacity as Responsible Authority and includes any person who is present to assist or make representations on behalf of the Responsible Authority including a Lawyer.

# 3 Key Principles

- 3.1 The principles of 'natural justice', and Article 6 'Right to a Fair Trial', which is one of the Convention Rights in the Human Rights Act 1998, require that there is a fair Hearing of Applications.
- 3.2 Natural justice is an umbrella term for the legal standards of basic fairness. This will include that:
  - 3.2.1 the Applicant has an opportunity to make representations before a decision is made;
  - 3.2.2 those making representations have an opportunity to voice their representations before a decision is made;
  - 3.2.3 the Applicant has an adequate opportunity to consider and respond to any submissions made by a Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation;

- 3.2.4 the Committee does not exclude an Applicant from a Hearing in order to consider submissions from a Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation.
- 3.3 It is also fundamental that there is an orderly presentation of submissions at a Hearing so that the relevant issues are properly understood, evidence is tested and that oral statements made at the Hearing are accurately recorded.
- 3.4 Ultimately the Chairperson determines the application of these rules, having regard to any submissions being made by those present and in particular the Committee Lawyer.

# 4 The Hearing

- 4.1 The Hearing shall take place in public.
  - 4.1.1 The Committee may exclude the public from all or part of the Hearing where it considers it to be in the public interest to do so and, in accordance with the Local Government (Access to Information) Act 1985, as amended. Public includes a party and any person assisting or representing a party.
  - 4.1.2 The Committee may require any person attending the Hearing who, in its opinion, is behaving in a disruptive manner, to leave the Hearing and may:
    - A refuse to permit them to return;
    - B permit them to return only on such conditions as the Committee may specify;
    - C in the event that a person is required to leave a Hearing that person may, before the end of the Hearing, submit to the Committee in writing any information which they would have given orally.
- 4.2 Prior to the Hearing commencing, the Chairperson shall advise the parties of the procedure it proposes to follow at the Hearing.
- 4.3 Where a party has previously requested permission for a person(s), other than their representative, to appear at the Hearing then the Committee shall consider whether to permit that request.
- 4.4 The Committee will allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights.
- 4.5 This equal maximum time may have been notified in advance of the Hearing;
- 4.6 Where there are a number of people who have attended the Hearing to make the same representation then the Committee would normally require that a spokesperson be appointed by them to make the representations on behalf of all of those who have made Relevant Representations.

## 5 Presentation of Submissions

- 5.1 The Chairperson will introduce the Application.
- 5.2 In the event that the Licensing Authority has given notice to a party requiring clarification on a point(s) then that party shall respond to the points raised by the Licensing Authority.
- 5.3 Submissions shall be made in the following order unless the Chairperson directs otherwise:
  - 5.3.1 The Licensing Officer will orally present the Committee Report and will in particular advise the Committee as to:
    - A the options available to it;
    - B the considerations that are relevant in reaching its decision.
  - 5.3.2 The Applicant (or the Applicant's Representative) will orally present its submission which may include:
    - A presenting their case in accordance with the papers, which will have been circulated with Agenda papers;
    - B confirming key information and answer pertinent questions; and
    - C calling witnesses in support of the Application (see paragraph 4.3).
  - 5.3.3 A Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation will orally present their representations in turn which shall include:
    - A the grounds of the representation to the Application; and
    - B any condition(s) that the Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation would be happy to have the Application granted subject to which would cause the representation to be withdrawn.

## 6 Questioning of Submissions

- 6.1 The Chairperson will regulate the order in which questions are asked by Members.
- 6.2 The Chairperson and Members, voiced through the Chairperson, may question any party following the completion of their submission.
- 6.3 The Chairperson will normally permit the Applicant, a Responsible Authority/Authorities or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation to ask questions through them of the other parties.
- 6.4 The Chairperson may direct that questions which are not relevant to the Application or one of the four Licensing Objectives are not formally put or answered.

## 7 Documentation

7.1 No party shall present new documentation to the Committee at the Hearing other than with the consent of all of the other parties. This does not preclude the Licensing Officer from correcting errors, providing updated information or an extract from a local map showing the Applicant's Premises in the context of the surrounding premises and any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation . If any party is granted permission to present supplementary papers at the Hearing they shall provide at least 10 copies at the start of their submission.

## 8 Intervention

The Chairperson shall permit the following interventions at any point in the Hearing:

- 8.1 The Committee Lawyer to advise the Committee on issues of law, procedure and relevant considerations on decision making. If necessary, the Chairperson may require the Committee, the Committee Lawyer and the Committee Manager to leave the Hearing so that advice can be given.
- 8.2 The Committee Manager to advise the Committee on procedure generally, or to request that statements made are repeated for reasons of clarity and so that they can be properly recorded.
- 8.3 The Licensing Officer to seek to clarify statements that have been made in light of information held on their file.

# 9 Failure of Parties to Attend Hearing

- 9.1 If a party has informed the Licensing Authority that it does not intend to attend or be represented at a Hearing, the Hearing may proceed in its absence.
- 9.2 If a party has not indicated that it does not intend to attend or be represented at a Hearing and fails to attend or be represented at the Hearing then the Licensing Authority may:
  - 9.2.1 where it considers it be necessary in the public interest, adjourn the Hearing to a specified date; or
  - 9.2.2 hold the Hearing in the party's absence.
- 9.3 Where the Licensing Authority holds a Hearing in the absence of a party, it shall consider at the Hearing the application, representations or notice made by that party.

# 10 Closing Submissions

10.1 The Chairperson shall allow first, the Responsible Authority/Authorities and any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation to make a closing oral submission(s) and secondly invite the Applicant or the Applicant's Representative an opportunity to make an oral closing submission in support of the Application.

# 11 Decision

- 11.1 The Committee, the Committee Lawyer and the Committee Manager, shall retire so that the decision may be considered in private, and to consider any legal issues raised by the Members.
- 11.2 The decision, and reasons for the decision, of the Committee shall be communicated orally by the Chairperson to the parties after the Committee has deliberated in private on the Application.
- 11.3 Written reasons shall be provided soon after the deliberations of the Application and in any event within the statutory time limits.

# **Hearing Procedure Summary**

- 1. The Democratic Services Officer will request nominations for a Chairman for the Hearing.
- 2. The Chairperson welcomes all those present and introduces the Application.
- 3. The Chairperson introduces the members of the Sub Committee and invites all parties present (Applicant, Responsible Authority/Authorities, any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation and Council Officers) to introduce themselves.
- 4. The Chairperson outlines the Hearing Procedure as set out in the Agenda, makes any relevant announcements and asks for any declarations of interest.
- 5. The Licensing Officer is asked to present their Committee Report.
- 6. The Applicant/their representative is invited to address the Sub Committee in support of their application.
- 7. Questions to the Applicant by Members of the Sub Committee.
- 8. Questions to the Applicant by Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation which are to be directed through the Chairperson.
- 9. Any Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation are invited to address the Sub Committee in support of their representations.
- 10. Questions to the Responsible Authorities/those who have made a Relevant Representation by Members of the Sub Committee.
- 11. Questions to the Responsible Authorities/those who have made a Relevant Representation by the Applicant, which are to be directed through the Chairperson.
- 12. Closing submissions by those Parties who have made a Relevant Representation in reverse order.
- 13. Closing submissions by the Applicant.
- 14. Sub Committee retires with the Committee Lawyer and Committee Manager to consider its decision.
- 15. Sub Committee returns and the Lawyer gives a summary of any legal advice that may have been given to the Sub Committee.
- 16. The Chairperson either gives the decision with reasons, or advises that it will be released in writing with reasons within the statutory time limits (5 working days).

# Application for a Variation of a Premises Licence; Crown & Anchor, Crowood Lane, Ramsbury, Marlborough, SN8 2PT

# 1. Purpose of Report

1.1 To determine an application for a variation of a Premises Licence in respect of the Crown & Anchor, Crowood Lane, Ramsbury, SN8 2PT made by Mr Raymond Penny.

# 2. Background Information

- 2.1 An application for a variation of a Premises Licence in respect of the Crown & Anchor, Crowood Lane, Ramsbury, SN8 2PT has been made by Mr Raymond Penny, for which 29 relevant representations against the application have been received, along with 2 letters and a petition of support for the application.
- 2.2 Wiltshire Council (as the Licensing Authority) must hold a hearing to consider the application having regard to the representations. In accordance with Section 35(3) of The Licensing Act 2003 the Licensing Sub Committee is required to take such of the steps listed in 2.4 below as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. In considering the application and the relevant representations, the Sub Committee must also have regard to relevant Government guidance and the Council's Licensing Policy.
- 2.3 The licensing objectives are:
  - i) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder;
  - ii) Public Safety;
  - iii) The Prevention of Public Nuisance; and
  - iv) The Protection of Children from Harm.
- 2.4 Such steps are:
  - i) To modify the conditions of the licence.
  - ii) To reject the whole or part of the application.
  - iii) To grant the application as applied for.
- 2.5 On 6<sup>th</sup> September 2016 an application for a variation of the existing premises licence was accepted as a valid application.

- 2.6 The details of the original variation applied for, are as follows:
  - Extend the hours for the sale of alcohol and add live and recorded music onto the premises licence, as follows:

• To update the plan of the premises.

A copy of the original application form is attached as **Appendix 1**. The plans accompanying the application are attached as **Appendix 2**.

2.7 Since 24<sup>th</sup> November 2005, the premise has benefited from a premises licence issued under the Licensing Act 2003. The current premises licence authorises the following:

- 2.8 The current Premises Licence is attached as **Appendix 3.**
- 2.10 A licensing inspection was carried out at the premises on 18<sup>th</sup> August 2016. The Licensing Authority had received a complaint alleging music coming from the premises was causing a disturbance, on some occasions until 23:45hrs. The premises licence did not authorise regulated entertainment in the form of live and/or recorded music and therefore this needed to be investigated.
- 2.11 The complainant and licence holder were informed that as a result of the Legislative Reform (Entertainment Licensing) Order 2014, which came into force on 6<sup>th</sup> April 2015, the following activities no longer require a licence:
  - A performance of amplified live music between 08:00 and 23:00 on any day on premises licensed to sell alcohol ON the premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.

- Any playing of recorded music between 08:00 and 23:00 on any day on a premises that is licensed to sell alcohol ON the premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- 2.12 Following the inspection, the licence holder was issued with a written warning and informed that if he wished to have live and recorded music past 23:00hrs, a variation of the premises licence would be necessary. Furthermore the plan of the premises licence that the Licensing Authority held on file, differed slightly from the layout of the premises, and therefore the licence holder was advised to complete an application to update it, which has resulted in the subsequent variation application.
- 2.13 As a result of the concerns raised in the representations, a meeting was held by the Parish Council on the 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2016; the applicant was invited to attend, along with residents. Following this meeting the applicant amended the original application, as follows:

2.14 Following further correspondence, the Parish Council was still concerned about the hours for music and alcohol till 00:00hrs on both Friday and Saturday. Consequently the applicant made further and final amendments, and changed live and recorded music so that the terminal hour on a Friday was 23:30hrs. Please see table below:

- 2.15 In light of the agreed amendments detailed in the above table, six of the representations were subsequently withdrawn. These representations have therefore not been included in this report.
- 2.16 During the consultation period, the applicant agreed to add a number of conditions to the premises licence, following a visit from the Environmental Health Officer, John Freegard. The conditions as agreed are attached as **Appendix 4.**
- 2.17 Public Health also asked the applicant, who agreed, to include the following conditions on the premises licence, in order to promote the licensing objectives:
  - A Challenge 25 Policy will be implemented at the premises; staff will receive appropriate training in relation to this policy.
  - The premises will implement a refusals book; staff will receive appropriate training in relation to this procedure.
- 2.18 Attached as **Appendix 5** is a location plan of the premises. Information on other licensed premises in the vicinity of the area is as follows:

## 4. Legal Implications

- 4.1 This hearing is governed by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations. These provide that hearings should be held in public unless the Licensing Authority considers that the public interest in excluding the public outweighs the public interest in the hearing taking place in public.
- 4.2 The Applicant and those who have made relevant representations have been informed of the date, time and location of the hearing and their right to attend and be represented.
- 4.3 At the hearing the applicant and those who have made relevant representations are entitled to address the Sub Committee and to ask questions of the other party, with the consent of the Sub Committee.

## 5. Officer Recommendations

5.1 Officers are not permitted to make a recommendation – the decision is to be reached by the members of the Licensing Sub Committee.

# 6. Right of Appeal

- 6.1 It should be noted that the Premises Licence Holder, and those who have made relevant representations, may appeal the decision made by the Licensing Sub Committee to the Magistrates Court. The appeal must be lodged with the Magistrates Court within 21 days of the notification of the decision.
- 6.2 In the event of an appeal being lodged, the decision made by the Licensing Sub Committee remains valid until any appeal is heard and any decision made by the Magistrates Court.
- 6.3 A Responsible Authority or any person may apply to the Licensing Authority for a Review of a Premises Licence. Whether or not a Review Hearing takes place is in the discretion of the Licensing Authority, but, if requested by a person other than a Responsible Authority will not normally be granted within the first 12 months except for the most compelling circumstances.



## Licensing Act 2003 CONDITIONS

#### **ANNEX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS**

#### **Supply of Alcohol**

1. Where this Licence authorises the supply of alcohol:

No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence:

- (a) At a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence
- (b) At a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is suspended

Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.

#### **Exhibition of Films**

- 1. Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the licence must include a condition requiring the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with this section.
- 2. Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection (3)(b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation by that body.
- 3. Where:-
  - (a) The film classification body is not specified in the licence, or
  - (b) The relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question,

admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

4. In this section "children" means any person aged under 18; and

"film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under Section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984(c39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

#### **Irresponsible Promotions**

- 1. The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- 2. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—.
    - i. drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or.
    - ii. drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);.

- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise antisocial behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability

#### **Free Tap Water**

1. The responsible person must ensure that free potable tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available. (*This means that responsible persons at all premises must ensure customers are provided with potable (drinking) water for free if they ask for it.*)

#### **Age Verification Policy**

1.

- (a) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (b) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (c) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
  - i. a holographic mark, or.
  - ii. an ultraviolet feature.

#### **Drink Volume Measures**

- 1. The responsible person shall ensure that:
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
    - i. beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - ii. gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - iii. still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- 2. these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and.
- 3. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

#### **Permitted** Price

1.

- (a) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- (b) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
  - A. "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
  - B. "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where-

- i. P is the permitted price,
- ii. D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- iii. V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol:
- C. "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
  - i. the holder of the premises licence,
  - ii. the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - iii. the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence:
  - D. "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
  - E. "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 2. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph B of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 3. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph B of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
  - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

#### Door Supervision (except theatres, cinemas, bingo halls and casinos)

- 1. Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must:
  - (a) be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; or
  - (b) be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of the Act.
- 2. But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed:
  - (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films); or

- (b) in respect of premises in relation to:
  - i. any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
  - ii. any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act.
- 3. For the purposes of this section:
  - (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and, which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act, (see Section 3(2) of that Act) and
  - (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

Further to my site visit yesterday, I would just like to confirm in writing, what we discussed to be inserted into licensing objective M d) The prevention of public nuisance:

DPS on site at all times to take all reasonable measures to manage and control noise emissions from regulated entertainment.

These management measures shall include:

- Control of internal source noise levels and bass component to ensure that the impact outside is not unreasonable
- A reduction of source noise level by 5dB between 23:00 and 00:00hrs
- Closure of windows facing residential properties during regulated entertainment
- Management of the numbers and frequency of events so as not to cause an unreasonable incremental impact on the locality
- Regular checks externally to ensure that the impact is not unreasonable





The Crown & Anchor is a pub and people living near should expect some level of noise. I'm sure he evaluated this before taking up residency.
- 2. Mr Hayley has never used the pub since I have been here. I take issue with Mr Hayley's comment about noisy clientele. Again, this is only assumption, totally unfounded and not evidence at all.

#### Roz Twigger

- 1. I totally disagree, as I said before there is only one child of school age in the vicinity. Not full of children of school age as she states, and the pub is not in the heart of the village it is on the out skirts of the village.
- 2. M/s Twigger has obviously read the variation wrong. I bringing the license up to date the garden must be on the plan if people are going to drink in the garden. I am not planning on having 'A Glastonbury Festival' in the garden. If anyone does drive we have a large car park for this. M/s Twigger has never complained to me about noise. M/s Twigger does not use the Crown & Anchor.
- 3. There is absolutely no evidence that any unruly behaviour has ever emulated from the Crown & Anchor, so why should that change. In fact some days of the week I shut before 11o/c. An extra hour would just allow me flexibility when and if needed. I believe this was one of the main reasons in the change in licensing.
- 4. This comment is irrelevant to the license application

I am very considerate and aware of my locality. Neighbours should also be considerate and aware that they live near a pub. It does work both ways (or should do)

#### Ben Wells.

- 1. Totally disagree as I have mentioned before. Mr Wells does have a young child but they live almost 200+m away. He has never complained to me.
- 2. There has never been anyone outside the pub when we have had live music so this is totally untrue and unfounded.
- 3. In answer to Mr Wells letter: Paragraph by paragraph.

Mr Wells lives at least 200mt from the pub. As I have said above he has never raised any concerns over noise from the pub. There aren't a lot of children living in the vicinity of the pub, he has one and Mr Segal has one. I am not intending to play amplified music outside. Mr Wells has read this



totally wrong. I am bringing the garden onto the license so people are able to enjoy a drink there. Therefore, it would not be a public nuisance and irrelevant.

As already stated, my reason for the variation is for the enjoyment of those who use the pub. We need to preserve our heritage pubs. The Crown & Anchor has been a pub since 1842. The pub has seen a roller-coaster of popularity. In this day and age with more and more people entertaining at home, pubs are having a hard time, but people still do visit pubs, albeit a little later in the evening. I totally disagree with Mr Wells assumption of a 'honeypot for drinkers' from far and wide. Let's not forget we are near Marlborough and Hungerford, there are a lot more licensed premises in these areas and with later licenses than 12o/c. Drinkers nowadays do not migrate. Music is not played late and people do not stand outside (Mr Wells appears to have forgotten that the music is inside) therefore an unfounded comment that there is noise from revellers. Mr Wells must be mistaken, maybe neighbours enjoying themselves. He then appears to contradict himself in saying that it is otherwise a quiet village.

As for the last paragraph, this is total nonsense and a blatant lie; the blue notice has always been in full view in front of the pub as per received instructions. I have been as transparent as I can be as I have nothing to hide.

In closing it is obvious that all these objections are totally unfounded and based on assumptions, none of them offer any evidence in support of their allegations. The Crown & Anchor is a lovely British Heritage pub and long may it remain so. I have been in this industry for almost 40 years and it has never ceased to amaze me that certain people move in close proximity to a pub, never use the facility and then complain. #### Mr R Hall

- 1. I am quite surprised at this coming from Mr hall as he uses the pub on live music nights, so this comes across as a bit hypocritical. Only one family with children close by.
- 2. There isn't and there never has been, in my time, any rowdiness. Evidence please Mr Hall.
- 3. The Crown & Anchor cannot be held responsible for burglaries. I take issue with Mr Hall suggesting that my customers are burglars. This comment is totally irrelevant.
- 4. The pub is hardly ever busy. I have a car park for clientele. I can't see the relevance of the junction we are on, to my application. The junction is far busier in the mornings during the school run.
- i. I will be monitoring the volume of all music at all times
- ii. The kitchen has nothing to do with this application
- iii. I do not envisage an increase in traffic volume as most customers walk to the pub (like Mr Hall) the worse traffic is always in the mornings. The majority of parked vehicles in Whittonditch road is compounded during the day and mostly belong to tradesmen working in houses such as Mr Halls. As far as I'm aware there has never been any instance where emergency vehicles are unable to get through outside the pub. My customers are always encouraged to use the pubs carpark.

Wendy Allen and Paul Segal (by paragraph) Rep; 7+8

- 1. The Crown & Anchor is not in a conservation area. I fail to see how m/s Allen knows the accounts for The Crown & Anchor and really irrelevant to the application.

#### **The Crown & Anchor Ramsbury**

I am writing to you as I understand that there may have been a complaint about noise emanating from the Crown & Anchor on a Saturday evening when they had some live music in the pub.

I am a retired Solicitor and live next door to the Crown & Anchor. My front door is directly across the mouth of Crowood Lane, some 10 yards only from the pub, and so I am probably the closest house. I have lived here for 38 years and have seen a variety of Landlords come and go. All of them have had busy times and quiet times. Some have had live music and others haven't but I can honestly say that none of the activities at the pub have ever caused any nuisance or disruption to me. The present Landlord has had several music nights but none has been intrusive to me or my family, and as I say I live very close.

Indeed, when we moved into our present house we knew that there was a pub opposite and back in the late 1970's it was pretty busy. It is clearly a conscious decision to move next door to a pub and whether one is a next door neighbour or a near neighbour, one knows perfectly well what one should expect from a pub. It is good that the pub is busy: it is important from the Landlord's point of view obviously but also from the point of view of the Village as a whole. What better than to have a thriving pub in your Village? There is less choice of entertainment in rural areas than in towns, so it is good that someone puts on some entertainment, makes an effort.

Of course, none of the above would be valid if the music were so loud as to be annoying or intrusive, but I repeat that none of my family has found it so. Perhaps the complainant has some other agenda – I do not know. All I can do is to state it as it is to me and I know that the pub is not noisy and I really cannot see what there is to complain about. I have lived in Ramsbury for 6 years in my position as Resident Estate Manager of an independent housing scheme. In that time, I have seen the Crown & Anchor change from a dull, dingy, old-fashioned drinking house into a bright, friendly, family-orientated public house & restaurant which befits the character of the village.

The reason for this transformation is the result of efforts made by the landlord, Mr Ray Penny, who has worked tirelessly since he took over the pub, thus bringing it into the 21<sup>st</sup> century. The décor, food, drink & quality of service is everything the discerning customer requires. The pub is further complimented by 2 modern, well-appointed suites which are available for bed & breakfast.

Just like any landlord, Mr Penny is eager to attract customers to his establishment & organises charity quiz nights & regular acoustic folk nights where local musicians entertain villagers & visitors alike.

Occasionally, he also provides suitable live acts who perform in the bar area. I have attended a number of these sessions & like many other customers, have thoroughly enjoyed the performances. The performers are usually solo acts & it has always been possible to hold a conversation even when they are playing. The bar area is <u>not</u> conducive to loudly amplified groups, hence the reason for the landlord's choice of artistes.

Mr Penny is acutely aware of his surroundings & chooses acts pertinent to the age group & clientèle of the pub. He determines the noise level of the acts when they set up & adheres rigidly to their performance times. The only time when music has been played after normal opening times is New Year's Eve when most of the village enjoys welcoming in the New Year.

I'm appalled to learn that there has been a complaint regarding noise from the pub. Some properties are only a road's width away so there's BOUND to be *some* noise at times but this is no different the sort of noise levels that *any* house owner deals with when living in close proximity of others. I would argue that there is probably more ROAD noise by the pub which sits on a busy junction used by heavy farm machinery, HGV & all other road users.

To prevent Mr Penny from providing a much needed facility in Ramsbury would not only be detrimental to his business but it would displease MANY locals who thoroughly appreciate the service he provides.

The complaints are without foundation.





I wish to object to the above application, which is for an extension to the license of the Crown & Anchor Pub in Ramsbury.

I live 50-100 yards from the pub and it is my belief that the granting of any extension is not in the interest either of those living nearby nor the community as a whole. There are many households with young children (mine included) in the immediate vicinity of the pub and an extension of the license with the accompanying right to play amplified music outside of the building represents a very real public nuisance, not only to the children but the village in general.

Given the absence of other establishments with late licenses in the area, it is not unreasonable to suggest that should the C&A be granted this application it would quickly become a honey pot for drinkers from far and wide. As it stands, music is already played late and people gather outside the pub, making a noise on a regular basis. We can hear it clearly from our house even with the windows closed and any such extension would constitute a major disruption to what is an otherwise quiet village.

It should be noted that until recently the public notification for this application amounted to a single poster on a lamp-post in a part of the village with low footfall, which would appear to be an underhand approach to having the application granted.

#### **OBJECTION TO CROWN & ANCHOR VARIATION APPLICATION WK/201622154**

I object to the variation application WK/201622154 on the following grounds.

#### To prevent public nuisance

The Crown & Anchor public house is on a crossroads just east of the centre of Ramsbury village, completely surrounded by residential housing, in a conservation area and area of outstanding natural beauty. For many years it has been a commercially successful concern under the existing licensing hours for alcohol sales until 11.00pm Monday to Saturday and until 10.30pm on Sundays.



The proposed licence extension and updated premises plan would create a public nuisance, over and above that currently caused, with customers leaving after midnight through a heavily residential area, after an extra hour of drinking, and with amplified music able to be played until midnight both inside and outside the pub.

There have been public nuisance issues with customers of the Crown & Anchor leaving late at night, especially during the past year where Mr Penny, the licensee and Designated Premises Supervisor, has breached his licence and the provisions of the 2003 Licensing Act

by allowing amplified music to be played and alcohol to be consumed until later than 11.00pm on numerous Saturday evenings. The complaints related to customers standing outside the pub after 11.00pm smoking and talking loudly, leaving noisily, and to noise and vibration from amplified music played within the pub after 11.00pm.

Mr Penny was formally written to by the Wiltshire Public Protection department in relation to these breaches during August 2016.

The instances include but are not limited to:

Saturday 6th August - Gordon Blackwell Live - music stopped around 11.40pm Saturday 23rd July - Paul Green Live - music stopped around 11.30pm Saturday 9th July - Disco (amplified) - music stopped around 11.30pm Saturday 2nd July - Smudge Live - music stopped around 11.35pm Saturday 21st May - George Wilding - music stopped around 11.30pm Saturday 7th May - Metson Live - music stopped around 11.30pm

Mr Penny posted the following publicly on social media, on 12th August 2016;



The complaints made regarded after hours activities at the Crown & Anchor, and the posting above provides evidence from Mr Penny that there has been public nuisance caused by drunk customers leaving the pub late at night - later than the current licence but earlier than the proposed licence variation. It also raises doubts of public safety over the attitude that Mr

Penny takes to valid complaints, and his judgement in publically identifying a complainant and his family's address.

The Bell Inn, about 350 meters away at the other end of Oxford Street, closes at 11.00pm Monday to Saturday. If the application is accepted, customers from the Bell Inn could walk up Oxford Street to the Crown & Anchor after 11.00pm and then leave the Crown & Anchor, after an additional hour's drinking, at 12.00am, or later, therefore doubling the nuisance.

Mr Penny offers up some additional steps for the prevention of public nuisance, but these raise more questions than they answer.

- Is Mr Penny the only D.P.S? Can he practically be on site at all times?
- How will the noise levels be recorded and calibrated?
- What equipment will be used and how reliable is it?
- How will vibration be monitored?
- Who will independently monitor the recordings?
- Will noise levels be monitored when events are held outside in the expanded premises plan, and how?
- Who will monitor customers at all times?

#### Public safety

Mr Penny suggests that advice signs are posted at predominant areas and positions, but does not specify what advice will be given, or where these positions are located. Again, if Mr Penny is the only D.P.S. can be guaranteed to be on site at all times?

#### Prevention of crime and disorder

The same steps of "D.P.S on site at all times" as suggested under the public safety and prevention of public nuisance sections indicates that this is not being taken seriously by the applicant.

Mr Penny himself indicates that ending amplified music at the correct time for a music event held on 17th September 2016 is the fault of "a sensitive neighbour" rather than a duty he has under his licence and the relevant laws. This is evidenced by a copy of an email (below) sent by Mr Penny to the Crown & Anchor bulk e-mail list after his receipt of the formal letter from Wiltshire Public Protection referred to above.

Given this, it is difficult to take seriously the additional steps outlined by Mr Penny to promote the four licensing objects.

#### Suggested actions

With the caveat that the proposed extension in hours for alcohol sales or the addition of live and recorded music to the licence would increase public nuisance, substantive actions that could be taken to minimise public nuisance before 11.00pm could include:

- Double-glazing on all ground-floor windows and doors where they are not currently double-glazed.
- All doors and windows to be kept closed whilst amplified music is playing, with no exit
  or entrance allowed while amplified music is playing. D.P.S. to supervise.
- Prominent "Please leave quietly and be respectful of our neighbours" signs at all entrances and exits.
- Additional sound-proofing.
- A smoking area to be established at the back of the pub, with no smoking allowed along either frontage.
- Meaningful noise monitoring.

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



Given this, it is difficult to take seriously the additional steps outlined by Mr Penny to promote the four licensing objects.

#### Suggested actions

With the caveat that the proposed extension in hours for alcohol sales or the addition of live and recorded music to the licence would increase public nuisance, substantive actions that could be taken to minimise public nuisance before 11.00pm could include:

- Double-glazing on all ground-floor windows and doors where they are not currently double-glazed.
- All doors and windows to be kept closed whilst amplified music is playing, with no exit
  or entrance allowed while amplified music is playing. D.P.S. to supervise.
- Prominent "Please leave quietly and be respectful of our neighbours" signs at all entrances and exits.
- Additional sound-proofing.
- A smoking area to be established at the back of the pub, with no smoking allowed along either frontage.
- Meaningful noise monitoring.

#### Objective 2 – To prevent public nuisance

The level of noise from the music events currently run at the Crown & Anchor is intrusive. From our nearby home the noise can be heard inside the house even with doors and double-glazed windows firmly shut. Though we have accepted this on the relatively rare occasions that these events take place, more regular events which run later into the evening will be unacceptably intrusive and will undoubtedly constitute a public nuisance.

This is a particular issue in a quiet village within an area of outstanding natural beauty. The village is also located in a valley, which means that the sound is further amplified as it echoes around the surrounding hills.

#### Objective 3 – To prevent crime and disorder

An extension to the licensing hours will encourage later / longer / excessive drinking with the attendant behavioural and noise problems that result.

#### Objective 4 -- To protect public safety

Extending the premises licence to include the current beer garden (and potentially the parking area – the drawing submitted with the application is not clear) will open up the possibility of larger, more regular outside and marquee-based events – birthday parties, weddings etc.

These will not only be noisy (see comments on objective 2 above) but will also cause parking / traffic problems in the immediate area. Ramsbury's narrow streets are already difficult to navigate due to the number of parked cars, and this is becoming an increasingly serious issue for our local volunteer fire brigade who also serve as our first response team in a medical emergency.


- Noise from the pub (both music and people) can already be heard late at night.

- There is another pub in the village which shuts at 11. It is not unreasonable to assume that once
  that closes there will be sizeable number of well-refreshed and undoubtedly loud people walking
  along Oxford St to continue drinking at the Crown & Anchor for more drinks, causing problems
  for residents all along the street.
- The very presence of late-license is likely to attract many more people to the pub from the surrounding area than otherwise would have been the case, with the consequential increase in traffic and parking requirements.





### Under OBJECTIVE No 2 "To Prevent Public Nuisance

- a. Our front door is approximately 100 metres from the front door of the above premises. We are regularly disturbed by groups of people passing our door on Sunday nights at 10.45pm who are talking loudly amongst themselves in what is a quiet residential lane. The bedroom window of our one bedroom house directly overlooks the front door. Our property is very small and there is no other part of the property to move to to isolate us from this nuisance.
- b. On Saturday nights we regularly experience disturbance of drunk people sitting on our front garden steps talking and drinking and smoking until about 1.00am. They frequently leave litter on the stairway.
- c. On Saturday nights during the summer we also have been kept awake with loud music coming from the interior of the premises. It is not pleasant to have the bedroom window firmly closed on a hot night in order to lessen the volume of sound
- d. For many years we have tolerated the constant sound and smell of the pub's kitchen ventilator fans running while being in our back garden.
- e. In the 16 years we have lived here we have accepted the occasional noise and smell at the rear of our house from various outdoor events (jazz bands and pop groups playing in the pub car park) but we would not find it at all acceptable for this to become a regular disturbance, particularly 'till midnight every night of the working week.

- a. The pub is located on a crossroads surrounded entirely by private residences many of which access directly on to the street (no front gardens). There are no other commercial premises in the area. To extend the licencing hours of opening would certainly cause additional traffic and noise in what is essentially accepted as a quiet neighbourhood at night.
- b. Currently other places of public gathering in the village, such as The Bell Pub, the Memorial Hall and the Church Rooms, all curtail their opening hours and activities to no later than 11.00pm. I do not see why there should be an exception in this case.


With regard to the proposed licence extension application at the Crown and Anchor public house, on Whittonditch Road, I would like to register my disapproval.

My objections are twofold. My first objection is on the grounds of public safety. The proposed changes will inevitably result in the current car park being used for the erection of marquees and/or staging, with the result that this will increase the amount of parking on and around the junction of Crowood Lane, Whittonditch Road, Oxford Street and Union Street. This is already an extremely hazardous junction, due to the fact that, because of the shallow nature of the junction, it is often regarded as a bend rather than a junction by some drivers. As a consequence traffic often travels at excessive speed when driving into Crowood Lane from Oxford Street and this proposal will only make matters worse. I have lived at Townfield for 26 years, and on numerous occasions when travelling down Crowood Lane from Townfield towards this junction, I've been faced with oncoming traffic travelling excessively fast, as I have attempted to pass vehicles parked in front of the Crown and Anchor. The situation is particularly bad when the current car park is full, and customers are forced to park on the road.

My second objection is on the grounds of public nuisance. Events have been held in the car park on previous occasions by previous incumbents, and the levels of noise have been excessive and the cause of much disturbance. This is particularly so in summer months when bedroom windows are open. The fact that it is proposed that there will be an extension in the hours of operation will exacerbate the problem even further.

Ramsbury is a village and the extended hours and the activities proposed are more in line with a non-residential City Centre.

This pub, The Crown and Anchor is on a cross road, surrounded by little houses very close to it. The pub also has b+b accommodation on the ground floor so the disturbance there would be harsh.

Already happening from the Crown & Anchor is: Noise Pollution, Air Pollution, and Light Pollution. To extend the above would be a calamity.

Other alcoholic venues in the village have reasonable hours. The Memorial Hall has even taken away its one outside side light, so no light pollution there. Written and verbal reminders there are given to depart quietly. This pub has major very bright outside lights reflecting hundreds of meters.

Noise Pollution from outside bands, in their car park, would be so antisocial. When played inside we still experience vibrations and sound, but so far not till midnight.

Air Pollution is well publicised and the motorbike and old car gatherings are noisy and so dangerous especially for our (12) grandchildren when visiting us; so much so, that these visitations have to be organized around such hazardous events. Barbeque smoke from outside gatherings aswell as pub exhaust fan smoke and greasy smells are not healthy.

Crime and disorder on the Crown & Anchors Saturday nights where we live, already is a bore, but the horror of extended hours would give us severe sleep deprivation. 6am getting up time or even earlier is the normal happening for many people living in the vicinity of this Pub

Already on these late night events, litter is trashed in the one laned Union Street. Garbage like cans, and bottles are thrown over our wall into our small front garden, and hanging plants vandilized. Our semidetached home then has its front steps, by noisy people at closing time, used and abused.

In our one bedroom, at the front of the home, we see and most defiantely hear this bad behaviour.

This is a Public Safety Issue.....so please leave this Public House hours well alone, and not extend outside venues in their car park.... To find parking in this village is already a catastrophy. As I said at the start, this is a village not a non-residential city centre.

### Licensing Act 2003 - Variation Application - Crown and Anchor, 1 Crowood Lane, Ramsbury, SN8 2PT

Following a public meeting of Ramsbury and Axford Planning Committee to discuss the variation application from the Crown and Anchor, Ramsbury, the Parish Council wish to make the following comments.

The meeting was attended by the Licensee of the Crown & Anchor and about 8 members of the public (mainly near neighbours of the Crown & Anchor).

The Parish Council wish to make representation under objective 2. To prevent public nuisance.

Having heard the views of the landlord of the Crown & Anchor and those of the public, the Planning Committee of the Parish Council has sympathy with the members of the public with regard to noise levels of live music. The Crown & Anchor is situated on a quiet crossroads surrounded by residential properties. They therefore suggested the following: that live music be played only until 11.30 on Friday and Saturday (the Landlord having mentioned that it would be only on one of these days and probably every other week). On other days of the week any live or recorded music must stop at 11pm.

The Committee agreed that it was reasonable to serve alcohol until midnight; except Sunday when the sale of alcohol should cease at 11pm.

The Committee agreed with the timings propose for Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve.
